A Resolution congratulating the Sequoyah High School Lady Indians for winning the Class 3A State Basketball Championship; commending them for winning their second consecutive title; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, Sequoyah High School's approximately 300 students represent 42 tribes and 14 different states. Students are eligible to attend if they are members of federally recognized Indian tribes or one-fourth blood descendants of such members. An Indian boarding school, it was founded in 1871 as an orphan asylum for those children whose parents were victims of the Civil War; and

WHEREAS, the Sequoyah High School Lady Indians basketball team became the first girls basketball team in school history to go through the regular season ranked Number One in Class 3A. Their regular season record of 20-2 was one of the best in the Lady Indians' history; and

WHEREAS, the Sequoyah High School Lady Indians basketball team defeated the Verdigris High School Lady Red Cardinals 60-45 to win

their second consecutive Class 3A State Basketball Championship and set a new school record of 27-2.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 50TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature congratulates the Sequoyah High School Lady Indians for winning the Class 3A State Basketball Championship.

THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature commends the Sequoyah High School Lady Indians for winning their second consecutive state title and setting a new school record of 27-2.

THAT a copy of this resolution be distributed to Sequoyah High School Superintendent Regina Stanley; Athletic Director Larry Grigg; Lady Indians Head Basketball Coach Bill Nobles; and Lady Indians Assistant Basketball Coach Jay Herrin.
