A Concurrent Resolution creating the Oklahoma Contractors Licensing Task Force; providing for purpose, composition, chair and vice-chair, meeting, report and staffing of task force.

WHEREAS, the State of Oklahoma has no regulations relating to contractors; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Legislature that the issues relating to the development of a comprehensive contractor's licensing act for this state be studied and recommendations be made for a contractor's licensing act.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 50TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

SECTION 1. A. There is hereby created until December 31, 2006, the Oklahoma Contractors Licensing Task Force. The purpose of the task force shall be:

1. To study the issues related to developing a comprehensive contractor's licensing act for this state;

2. To propose necessary statutory additions, amendments or changes; and

3. To submit final recommendations in a report to the Governor and the Legislature by December 31, 2006.

B. The Legislature requests that the following persons agree to serve as members of the task force:

1. Seven members to be appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, two of whom shall be members of the Senate, two of

whom shall be general building contractors, one of whom shall be a licensed contractor, either electrical, mechanical or plumbing, one of whom shall be from an unlicensed construction trade and one of whom shall be a member of the Construction Industries Board;

2. Seven members to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, two of whom shall be members of the House of Representatives, two of whom shall be general building contractors, one of whom shall be a licensed contractor, either electrical, mechanical or plumbing, one of whom shall be from an unlicensed construction trade and one of whom shall be a member of the Construction Industries Board;

3. The Director of the Department of Central Services or a designee;

4. The Administrator of the Construction Industries Board or a designee;

5. A representative of the Oklahoma Municipal Contractors Association;

6. A representative from the Oklahoma State Home Builders Association;

7. A representative of the Associated General Contractors Building Chapter;

8. A representative of the American Subcontractors Association of Oklahoma, Inc.; and

9. A representative of the Plumbing-Heating-Cooling Contractors of Oklahoma.

C. The chair shall be appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate. The vice-chair shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives. The chair shall convene the first meeting of the task force on or before July 15, 2006.

D. The Oklahoma State Senate and the Oklahoma House of Representatives shall provide staff support for the task force.
