WHEREAS, marriage is worthy of the support and encouragement of all members of society for its ability to uplift individuals and children because it provides a framework for positive and supportive role models for children.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 50TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

THAT February 7-14, 2005, be proclaimed as Marriage Week in the State of Oklahoma, and the Oklahoma House of Representatives invites all citizens to take due note of the observance and to commit themselves to valuing, strengthening and supporting strong marriages, beginning with their own.
