A Resolution commending law enforcement personnel; designating Peace Officers' Memorial Day and National Police Week.

WHEREAS, Congress and the President of the United States have designated May 15, 2005, as Peace Officers' Memorial Day, and the week in which May 15, 2005, falls as National Police Week; and

WHEREAS, the members of the law enforcement agencies of Oklahoma play an essential role in safeguarding the rights and freedoms of Oklahomans and unceasingly provide a vital public service; and

WHEREAS, it is important that all citizens know and understand the duties, responsibilities, hazards and sacrifices of their law enforcement agencies; and
