WHEREAS, many of our fellow citizens of Oklahoma took time from their daily duties to make a public statement, respecting the sanctity of human life and the worth of every unborn individual, and to speak with their elected officials and remind us of our duties to them with their gift of a rose; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of Oklahoma have come on this day to make their voices and their opinions known by giving a rose as a symbol of their stand for the right to life of the unborn.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 50TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:
