Oklahoma to win the Series; and directing

WHEREAS, in 2005 the Enid Majors American Legion Post 4 baseball team won the state American Legion title and the right to represent the State of Oklahoma in the American Legion Regional Tournament in Pine Bluff, Arkansas; and

WHEREAS, the Enid Majors lost the first game of the Regional Tournament and faced elimination; and

WHEREAS, the Enid Majors exhibited courage and pride found uniquely in Oklahomans and won five straight games, including a 4-3 thriller in the championship game, to advance and represent the great State of Oklahoma in the American Legion World Series in Rapid City, South Dakota; and

WHEREAS, the Enid Majors advanced to the finals against the Twin City Titans from the State of Washington; and

WHEREAS, the Titans defeated the Majors in the first game, giving the Majors their first loss of the World Series and forcing a second and decisive championship game between the two teams; and

WHEREAS, the Majors and the Titans found themselves tied in the winner-take-all championship game; and

WHEREAS, the Majors proceeded to load the bases with two outs in the bottom of the ninth; and
