A Concurrent Resolution commending two Marlow High School students for their heroic action in an emergency situation; thanking them for risking injuries; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, Marlow High School juniors Joseph Womack and Lee Tumblson were in Tumblson's truck returning to school from the Red River Technology Center when they noticed a lady slumped over the

seat of her moving car at the stop light at the intersection of U.S. 81 and Main Street in Marlow, Oklahoma; and

WHEREAS, Joseph Womack immediately jumped from the truck where he had been a passenger and proceeded to open the door of the car in an effort to try to stop the vehicle which was picking up speed, heading toward a row of parked automobiles; and

WHEREAS, the runaway vehicle hit a light pole, causing the door to close, crushing Womack's left hand. Womack, with a crushed hand, opened the passenger side of the vehicle, applied the brake and shifted into park; and

WHEREAS, Lee Tumblson meanwhile stopped his truck in the intersection and ran to the driver's side of the wrecked vehicle to assist in pulling the unconscious driver out of the car; and

WHEREAS, Joseph Womack was in excruciating pain, and his hand was bleeding profusely when taken to the emergency room at Duncan Regional Hospital; however, Womack was more concerned about the welfare of the apparent heart attack victim than his own pain.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 50TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature commends Joseph Womack and Lee Tumblson for their quick action and immediate response in an emergency situation.

THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature thanks Joseph Womack and Lee Tumblson for endangering themselves and sustaining injuries in order to assist a stranger in need.
