He graduated from U.S. Grant High School in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, in 1974 and received a Bachelors of Science in Biology from Southwestern Oklahoma State University. He did graduate studies in microbiology at Southwestern Oklahoma State University and attended the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine at the O.U. Health Sciences Center. After receiving his M.D., he attended the O.U. College of Medicine, Tulsa, for completion of his Family Practice residency and received his Board Certification in Family Practice; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Steven Drabek has been actively engaged in Family Practice in Yukon, Oklahoma, since 1987. A cancer survivor who has had more than his share of physical problems, Dr. Drabek has also served as Medical Director of Family Hospice of Oklahoma, as Associate Director of Hospice of Oklahoma County, with Hospice Care of Oklahoma, and currently with Frontier Hospice; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Steven Drabek has dedicated much of his time to mentoring medical students and physician assistants. He was named Physician of the Year from the Academy of Physician Assistants in 1997 and Preceptor of the Year from the Class of 2002 Physician

Associate program at the University of Oklahoma. He was recently the recipient of the 2006 T.J. Lowrey Humanitarian Award; and
