A Resolution thanking Senator Scott Pruitt for his service in the Oklahoma State Senate; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, Senator Scott Pruitt is completing his second term of service to the citizens of Senate District 36 in the Oklahoma State Senate; and

WHEREAS, Scott Pruitt was born on May 9, 1968, in Danville, Kentucky. He received a bachelor's degree in political science and communications from Kentucky's Georgetown College in 1990 and a Juris Doctor degree from the University of Tulsa in 1993. A practicing attorney, he is the general managing partner of the Oklahoma RedHawks, a Triple-A professional baseball team. He is married to the former Marlyn Lloyd and they have two children - McKenna and Caden; and

WHEREAS, Senator Scott Pruitt served as Republican Whip from 2000 to 2002 and as Assistant Republican Floor Leader since 2002. Senator Pruitt chaired the American Legislative Exchange Council's Civil Justice Task Force, was selected as part of a delegation to Israel in an exchange program with the American Council of Young Political Leaders, and received a Henry Toll Fellowship. He was named Legislative Advocate of the Year for 2004 by the Oklahoma Professional Economic Development Council; and

WHEREAS, Senator Scott Pruitt, unlike many others, is not prohibited by the provisions of State Question 632 from seeking reelection this year, but has announced his intention not to seek reelection to the Oklahoma State Senate; and

WHEREAS, Senator Scott Pruitt had an issue-driven career in the Oklahoma State Senate. His areas of involvement include efforts to reform the workers' compensation system, the lawsuit/tort system, the Medicaid system, the tax system, the local public school systems, and the welfare system; and

WHEREAS, although the Senate will be trading Scott Pruitt for a player to be named later, he will be remembered as a legislator who could throw, field, run, hit and hit for power. Although occasionally off base or in the middle of a bench-clearing brawl, his energy, vitality and drive have been employed during his Senate service for the good of this body, his district and the entire state.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 50TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

THAT the Oklahoma State Senate on behalf of the citizens of Senate District 36 and all citizens of this state thanks Senator Scott Pruitt for his service in the Oklahoma State Senate.
