A Resolution honoring the humanitarianism of Jason Fox; commending his selection as the 2005 Oklahoma Highway Users Federation Humanitarianism Award winner; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, Oklahoma Highway Patrol Trooper Jason Fox is the son of James C. "Muggs" Fox, who served with the Oklahoma Highway Patrol for 30 years before his election as Sheriff of Okfuskee County in 2001. Sheriff Fox was reelected in 2004 but was soon diagnosed with non-Hodgkin's lymphoma and died at the age of 70, shortly after his son, Jason Fox, was honored as the State's Trooper of the Year; and

WHEREAS, Oklahoma Highway Patrol Trooper Jason Fox happened upon an accident on Highway 56 in Okfuskee County on May 2, 2005, where two individuals had been ejected from their pickup truck and were near death. Trooper Fox treated the individual who had no pulse and was not breathing with cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), chest compression, and mouth-to-mouth resuscitation. However, as soon as one individual started breathing, the other stopped and Trooper Fox rushed between the two men, resuscitating whoever was closer to death; and

WHEREAS, Trooper Jason Fox continued this excruciating effort for eleven minutes until emergency assistance arrived. The two men were med-flighted to a hospital and survived, thanks to the continuing efforts of Trooper Fox who was ill and totally exhausted by the ordeal. As a result of risking his health to save the lives of two individuals, the Oklahoma Highway Users Federation selected

Oklahoma Highway Patrol Trooper Jason Fox to receive its 2005 Humanitarian Award.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 50TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

THAT the Oklahoma State Senate honors Jason Fox for his humanitarian effort that saved the lives of two individuals.

THAT the Oklahoma State Senate commends and congratulates Trooper Jason Fox for his selection as the recipient of the 2005 Oklahoma Highway Users Federation Humanitarian Award.

THAT a copy of this resolution be distributed to Oklahoma Highway Patrol Trooper Jason Fox and to Oklahoma Department of Public Safety Commissioner Kevin Ward.
