ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1485 - By: TIBBS and NANCE of the House and
CRAIN of the Senate.

[motor vehicles - expanding scope of circumstances for
towing certain vehicles - effective date]

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2001, Section 955, as
amended by Section 4, Chapter 387, O.S.L. 2002 (47 O.S. Supp. 2004,
Section 955), is amended to read as follows:

Section 955. A. Any officer of the Department of Public Safety
or any other political subdivision of this state is hereby
authorized to cause to be towed any vehicle found upon the roadway
when:

1. Report has been made that ~~such~~ the vehicle has been stolen
or taken without the consent of its owner;

2. The officer has reason to believe the vehicle has been
abandoned as defined in Sections 901 and 902 of this title;

3. The person driving or in control of ~~such~~ the vehicle is
arrested for an alleged offense for which the officer is required by

1 law to take the person arrested or summoned before a proper
2 magistrate without unnecessary delay; ~~or~~

3 4. At the scene of an accident, when the owner or driver is not
4 in a position to take charge of ~~his~~ the vehicle and direct or
5 request its proper removal; or

6 5. The officer has reason to believe that the person operating
7 the vehicle has not been granted driving privileges or that the
8 driving privileges of the person are currently suspended, revoked,
9 canceled, denied, or disqualified.

10 B. Each officer of the Department shall use the services of the
11 licensed wrecker operator whose location is nearest to the vehicle
12 to be towed in all instances in subsection A of this section. The
13 requests for services may be alternated or rotated among all ~~such~~
14 licensed wrecker operators who are located within a reasonable
15 radius of each other. In like manner, ~~such~~ the officer shall advise
16 any person requesting information as to the availability of a
17 wrecker or towing service, the name of the nearest licensed wrecker
18 operator, giving equal consideration to all licensed wrecker
19 operators located within a reasonable radius of each other. In
20 cities of less than fifty thousand (50,000) population, all ~~such~~
21 licensed wrecker operators located near or in the city limits of
22 such cities shall be considered as being equal distance and shall be
23 called on an equal basis as nearly as possible. In counties

1 bordering other states, if the officer deems safety and time
2 considerations warrant, the officer may call a wrecker or towing
3 service that is not on the rotation log.

4 C. Any officer of the Department who has been requested by a
5 person in need of wrecker or towing service to call a specific
6 wrecker or towing service for such person, and who calls a different
7 wrecker or towing service other than the one requested, without the
8 consent of ~~such~~ the person, except where hazardous conditions exist,
9 shall be suspended from the Department, without compensation, for a
10 period of thirty (30) days, except in instances where a vehicle is
11 removed from the roadway under the authority of paragraphs 3 and 4
12 of subsection A of this section.

13 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2005.
