COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1725 - By: TIBBS
of the House and WILLIAMSON of the Senate.

An Act relating to children; creating the Task Force on
Reactive Attachment Disorder in Children; providing for
membership; providing for certain processes of the task
force; providing for subcommittees; designating staff
support and state agency assistance; providing for task
force duties and responsibilities; providing for travel
reimbursement; requiring certain report; providing for
codification; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 7007-1.9 of Title 10, unless
there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. There is hereby created to continue until December 31, 2006,
the Task Force on Reactive Attachment Disorder in Children. The
task force will examine this issue as it relates to children in the
custody of the Department of Human Services or the Office of
Juvenile Affairs, and children served by the Department of Mental
Health and Substance Abuse Services. For purposes of this section,
"Reactive Attachment Disorder" means a disorder resulting from the
lack of reasonable care and nurturance, usually in the early years

1 of life, which results in an inability to establish normal, stable
2 attachments to caregivers and others.

3 B. The task force shall consist of eighteen (18) members as
4 follows:

5 1. The Director of the Department of Human Services, or
6 designee;

7 2. The Director of the Oklahoma Commission on Children and
8 Youth, or designee;

9 3. The State Superintendent of Public Instruction, or designee;

10 4. The Commissioner of the Department of Mental Health and
11 Substance Abuse Services, or designee;

12 5. The State Commissioner of Health, or designee;

13 6. The Administrator of the Oklahoma Health Care Authority, or
14 designee;

15 7. The Director of the Oklahoma Areawide Services Information
16 Systems, or designee;

17 8. The Executive Coordinator of the District Attorneys Council,
18 or designee;

19 9. The Executive Director of the Office of Juvenile Affairs, or
20 designee;

21 10. The Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives shall
22 appoint members as follows:

- 1 a. one member who serves on the Oklahoma House of
- 2 Representatives Health and Human Services Committee,
- 3 b. one member who is a foster-care or adoptive parent of
- 4 a child with Reactive Attachment Disorder, and
- 5 c. one member who is a mental health expert knowledgeable
- 6 in treating children with Reactive Attachment
- 7 Disorder;

8 11. The President Pro Tempore of the State Senate shall appoint
9 members as follows:

- 10 a. one member who serves on the Senate Health and Human
- 11 Resources Committee,
- 12 b. one representative of a statewide child advocacy
- 13 organization, and
- 14 c. one member who is a practicing attorney in the area of
- 15 child welfare and who is an active member of the
- 16 Family Law Section of the Oklahoma Bar Association;
- 17 and

18 12. The Governor shall appoint members as follows:

- 19 a. one member who is a pediatrician knowledgeable in the
- 20 area of Reactive Attachment Disorder in children,
- 21 b. one member who serves on a postadjudication review
- 22 board, chosen from a list of names submitted by the
- 23 State Postadjudication Review Advisory Board, and

1 c. one member who is a representative of the Oklahoma
2 Youth Services Center.

3 C. 1. Members shall serve at the pleasure of their appointing
4 authorities. A vacancy on the task force shall be filled by the
5 original appointing authority.

6 2. Appointments to the task force shall be made by July 1,
7 2005.

8 3. A majority of the members of the task force shall constitute
9 a quorum. A majority of the members present at a meeting may act
10 for the task force.

11 4. The Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives and the
12 President Pro Tempore of the State Senate shall each designate a
13 cochair from among the members of the task force.

14 5. The cochairs of the task force shall convene the first
15 meeting of the task force on or before July 15, 2005, at which time
16 a schedule of the meetings shall be determined.

17 6. The task force may divide into subcommittees in furtherance
18 of its purpose.

19 D. 1. Staff of the Department of Human Services shall serve as
20 primary staff for the task force with assistance from the staffs of
21 the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services and the
22 Office of Juvenile Affairs.

1 2. The task force may use the expertise and services of the
2 staffs of the Oklahoma House of Representatives and the Oklahoma
3 State Senate and may, as necessary, seek the advice and services of
4 experts in the field of child welfare.

5 E. All departments, officers, agencies and employees of this
6 state shall cooperate with the task force in fulfilling its duties
7 and responsibilities including, but not limited to, providing any
8 information, records or reports requested by the task force.

9 F. Members of the task force shall receive no compensation for
10 their service, but shall receive travel reimbursement as follows:

11 1. Legislative members of the task force shall be reimbursed
12 for necessary travel expenses incurred in the performance of their
13 duties in accordance with the provisions of Section 456 of Title 74
14 of the Oklahoma Statutes; and

15 2. Nonlegislative members of the task force shall be reimbursed
16 by their appointing authorities or respective agencies for necessary
17 travel expenses incurred in the performance of their duties in
18 accordance with the State Travel Reimbursement Act.

19 G. The duties and responsibilities of the Task Force on
20 Reactive Attachment Disorder in Children shall include, but not be
21 limited to:

22 1. Identifying the number of children in the custody of the
23 Department of Human Services or the Office of Juvenile Affairs or

1 the number served by the Department of Mental Health and Substance
2 Abuse Services who have Reactive Attachment Disorder or who may have
3 a predisposition for the disorder;

4 2. Assessing current resources available to families who have a
5 child with Reactive Attachment Disorder;

6 3. Determining if additional services are necessary including,
7 but not limited to, networking and support groups, treatment
8 options, information/resource links; and

9 4. Determining if conferences and training sessions are needed
10 for families who have a child with Reactive Attachment Disorder.

11 H. The task force shall publish its findings and
12 recommendations by December 31, 2006, including recommendations for
13 any resulting legislation.

14 SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
15 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
16 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
17 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
