ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1969 - By: PERRY of the House and GARRISON of the Senate.

An Act relating to roads, bridges and ferries; amending 69 O.S. 2001, Sections 1701, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 206, O.S.L. 2003, 1703, 1704, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2004, 1705, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 90, O.S.L. 2004, 1706, as amended by Section 3, Chapter 419, O.S.L. 2004 and Section 2, Chapter 206, O.S.L. 2003 (69 O.S. Supp. 2004, Sections 1701, 1704, 1705, 1706 and 1717.1), which relate to turnpikes; modifying the name of the Oklahoma Transportation Authority; modifying certain provisions relating to the reference of the name of the authority; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 69 O.S. 2001, Section 1701, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 206, O.S.L. 2003 (69 O.S. Supp. 2004, Section 1701), is amended to read as follows:

Section 1701. In order to facilitate vehicular traffic throughout the state and remove the present handicaps and hazards on the congested highways in the state, and to provide for the construction of modern express highways embodying reasonable safety devices including ample shoulder widths, long sight distances, the bypassing of cities and towns, and grade separations at intersecting highways and railroads, the Oklahoma ~~Transportation~~ Turnpike Authority, as created in Section 1703 of this title, is hereby

1 authorized and empowered to construct, maintain, repair, and operate  
2 turnpike projects as defined in Section 1704 of this title, at such  
3 locations as shall be approved by the Transportation Commission, and  
4 to issue turnpike revenue bonds of the Authority payable solely from  
5 revenues to pay the cost of such projects. The Authority is further  
6 authorized and empowered to develop and market alternative uses of  
7 the Oklahoma ~~Transportation~~ Turnpike Authority Electronic Toll  
8 Collection System, and construct, maintain, repair, and operate  
9 inter-modal transportation transfer facilities and infrastructure  
10 relating thereto, including, without limitation, warehouses and  
11 utility facilities and intercity rail transit projects as it shall  
12 determine to be feasible and economically sound.

13 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 69 O.S. 2001, Section 1703, is  
14 amended to read as follows:

15 Section 1703. A. There is hereby created a body corporate and  
16 politic to be known as the "Oklahoma ~~Transportation~~ Turnpike  
17 Authority" and by that name the Authority may sue and be sued, and  
18 plead and be impleaded. The Authority is hereby constituted an  
19 instrumentality of the state, and the exercise by the Authority of  
20 the powers conferred by this act in the construction, operation, and  
21 maintenance of turnpike projects shall be deemed and held to be an  
22 essential governmental function of the state with all the attributes  
23 thereof. Provided, however, the Turnpike Authority is authorized to

1 carry and shall carry liability insurance to the same extent and in  
2 the same manner as the Transportation Commission, and in addition  
3 thereto it shall be subject to the workers' compensation laws of the  
4 state the same as a private construction project.

5 B. The Oklahoma ~~Transportation~~ Turnpike Authority shall consist  
6 of the Governor, who shall be a member ex officio, and six (6)  
7 members to be appointed by the Governor, by and with the consent of  
8 the Senate. The appointive members shall be residents of the state,  
9 and shall have been qualified electors therein for a period of at  
10 least one (1) year next preceding their appointment. One appointive  
11 member shall be appointed from each of six districts of the state,  
12 such districts to include the area as follows:

13 District 1. Oklahoma, Canadian, Cleveland, McClain and Garvin  
14 Counties.

15 District 2. Washington, Nowata, Craig, Ottawa, Rogers, Mayes,  
16 Delaware, Wagoner, Cherokee, Adair, Okmulgee, Osage, Muskogee,  
17 Sequoyah, McIntosh and Haskell Counties.

18 District 3. Coal, Logan, Payne, Lincoln, Creek, Okfuskee,  
19 Pottawatomie, Seminole, Hughes and Pontotoc Counties.

20 District 4. Kay, Pawnee, Garfield, Noble, Tulsa, Woods,  
21 Woodward, Major, Alfalfa and Grant Counties.

22 District 5. Cimarron, Grady, Texas, Beaver, Harper, Ellis,  
23 Roger Mills, Dewey, Custer, Caddo, Washita, Beckham, Harmon,

1 Stephens, Jefferson, Greer, Kiowa, Jackson, Tillman, Comanche,  
2 Cotton, Kingfisher and Blaine Counties.

3 District 6. Carter, Love, Murray, Johnston, Marshall, Atoka,  
4 Bryan, Pittsburg, Latimer, Le Flore, Pushmataha, Choctaw and  
5 McCurtain Counties.

6 The members of the Authority appointed shall continue in office  
7 for terms expiring as follows: District 1, July 1, 1968; District  
8 2, July 1, 1971; District 3, July 1, 1972; District 4, July 1, 1973;  
9 District 5, July 1, 1974; District 6, July 1, 1975. Provided, that  
10 appointive members serving on the Oklahoma Turnpike Authority  
11 created by 69 O.S. 1961, Section 653, when this act becomes  
12 effective shall continue to serve as members of the Oklahoma  
13 Turnpike Authority created by this section, for the terms for which  
14 they were appointed, unless sooner removed by the Governor. The  
15 successor of each appointive member shall be appointed for a term of  
16 eight (8) years, except that any person appointed to fill a vacancy  
17 shall be appointed to serve only for the unexpired term, and a  
18 member of the Authority shall be eligible for reappointment. Each  
19 appointed member of the Authority before entering upon the duties of  
20 office shall take an oath as provided by Section 1 of Article XV of  
21 the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma. Any appointive member of  
22 the Authority may be removed by the Governor at any time with or  
23 without cause.

1 C. The Authority shall elect one of the appointed members as  
2 chairperson and another as vice-chairperson, and shall also elect a  
3 Secretary and Treasurer. A majority of the members of the Authority  
4 shall constitute a quorum and the vote of a majority of the members  
5 shall be necessary for any action taken by the Authority. No  
6 vacancy in the membership of the Authority shall impair the right of  
7 a quorum to exercise all the rights and perform all the duties of  
8 the Authority.

9 D. Before the issuance of any turnpike revenue bonds under the  
10 provisions of this act, each appointed member of the Authority shall  
11 execute a surety bond in the penal sum of Twenty-five Thousand  
12 Dollars (\$25,000.00) and the secretary and treasurer shall execute a  
13 surety bond in the penal sum of One Hundred Thousand Dollars  
14 (\$100,000.00), each such surety bond to be conditioned upon the  
15 faithful performance of the duties of the office, to be executed by  
16 a surety company authorized to transact business in the State of  
17 Oklahoma as surety and to be approved by the Governor and filed in  
18 the office of the Secretary of State.

19 E. The members of the Authority shall not be entitled to  
20 compensation for their services, but each member shall be reimbursed  
21 for actual expenses necessarily incurred in the performance of the  
22 duties of such member. All expenses incurred in carrying out the  
23 provisions of this act shall be payable solely from funds provided

1 under the authority of this act and no liability or obligation shall  
2 be incurred by the Authority hereunder beyond the extent to which  
3 monies shall have been provided under the authority of this act.

4 F. ~~The Authority created by this act shall be the legal~~  
5 ~~successor to the Oklahoma Turnpike Authority created by 69 O.S.~~  
6 ~~1961, Section 653, and shall assume all powers, duties, obligations~~  
7 ~~and responsibilities of such Authority, and is empowered to take~~  
8 ~~charge immediately.~~

9 G. Whenever the terms "Oklahoma ~~Turnpike~~ Transportation  
10 Authority", ~~Turnpike~~ Transportation Authority" or "Authority",  
11 when used in reference to the Oklahoma Turnpike Authority, appear in  
12 the Oklahoma Statutes, such terms shall mean the Oklahoma  
13 ~~Transportation~~ Turnpike Authority.

14 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 69 O.S. 2001, Section 1704, as  
15 amended by Section 1, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2004 (69 O.S. Supp. 2004,  
16 Section 1704), is amended to read as follows:

17 Section 1704. As used in this article, the following words and  
18 terms shall have the following meanings, unless the context shall  
19 indicate another or different meaning or intent:

20 1. "Authority" means the Oklahoma ~~Transportation~~ Turnpike  
21 Authority, created by Section 1703 of this title, or, if such  
22 Authority shall be abolished, the board, body, or commission

1 succeeding to the principal functions thereof or to whom the powers  
2 given by this article to the Authority shall be given by law;

3 2. "Project" or "turnpike project" means any express highways,  
4 superhighways, or motorways, wayports, aviation transfer centers or  
5 aviation hubs constructed under the provisions of this article by  
6 the Authority, and shall embrace all bridges, tunnels, overpasses,  
7 underpasses, interchanges, entrance plazas, approaches, free access  
8 roads, bridges, and road construction, toll houses, service  
9 stations, and administration, storage and other buildings which the  
10 Authority may deem necessary for the operation of such turnpike,  
11 together with all property, rights, easements and interests which  
12 may be acquired by the Authority for the construction or the  
13 operation of such turnpike. The Authority may contract or lease  
14 concessions for gas stations, garages, restaurants, parking  
15 facilities and other services for all or any portion of any turnpike  
16 project or projects;

17 3. "Cost", as applied to a turnpike project, shall embrace the  
18 cost of construction, the cost of the acquisition of all land,  
19 rights-of-way, property, rights, easements and interests acquired by  
20 the Authority for such construction, the cost of all machinery and  
21 equipment, financing charges, provision for working capital,  
22 interest prior to, during, and after construction and a reserve for  
23 interest in such amounts as the Authority shall determine, cost of

1 traffic estimates and of engineering and legal expenses, plans,  
2 specifications, surveys, estimates of cost, and of revenues, other  
3 expenses necessary or incident to determining the feasibility or  
4 practicability of constructing any such project, administrative  
5 expense, and such other expense as may be necessary or incident to  
6 the construction of the project, the financing of such construction,  
7 and the placing of the project in operation. Any obligation or  
8 expense incurred by the Transportation Commission with the approval  
9 of the Authority for traffic surveys, borings, preparation of plans  
10 and specifications, and other engineering services in connection  
11 with the financing and construction of a project shall be regarded  
12 as a part of the cost of such project and shall be reimbursed to the  
13 state out of the proceeds of the turnpike revenue bonds hereafter  
14 authorized. However, the Transportation Commission shall not incur  
15 obligations or expenses totaling more than One Thousand Five Hundred  
16 Dollars (\$1,500.00) per turnpike mile. Provided further, however,  
17 that an additional sum not to exceed One Thousand Dollars  
18 (\$1,000.00) per turnpike mile may be expended for updating reports  
19 prior to financing; and

20 4. "Owner" means and includes all individuals, copartnerships,  
21 associations, or corporations having any title or interest in any  
22 property, rights, easements, and interests authorized to be acquired  
23 by this article.

1 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 69 O.S. 2001, Section 1705, as  
2 last amended by Section 1, Chapter 90, O.S.L. 2004 (69 O.S. Supp.  
3 2004, Section 1705), is amended to read as follows:

4 Section 1705. The Oklahoma ~~Transportation~~ Turnpike Authority is  
5 hereby authorized and empowered:

6 (a) To adopt bylaws for the regulation of its affairs and  
7 conduct of its business.

8 (b) To adopt an official seal and alter the same at pleasure.

9 (c) To maintain an office at such place or places within the  
10 state as it may designate.

11 (d) To sue and be sued in contract, reverse condemnation,  
12 equity, mandamus and similar actions in its own name, plead and be  
13 impleaded; provided, that any and all actions at law or in equity  
14 against the Authority shall be brought in the county in which the  
15 principal office of the Authority shall be located, or in the county  
16 of the residence of the plaintiff, or the county where the cause of  
17 action arose. All privileges granted to the Authority and duties  
18 enjoined upon the Authority by the provisions of Sections 1701  
19 through 1734 of this title may be enforced in a court of competent  
20 jurisdiction in an action in mandamus.

21 (e) To construct, maintain, repair and operate turnpike  
22 projects and highways, with their access and connecting roads, at  
23 such locations and on such routes as it shall determine to be

1 feasible and economically sound; provided, that until specifically  
2 authorized by the Legislature, the Authority shall be authorized to  
3 construct and operate toll turnpikes only at the following  
4 locations:

5 (1) The Turner Turnpike between Oklahoma City and Tulsa.

6 (2) The Southwestern (H.E. Bailey) Turnpike between Oklahoma  
7 City and Wichita Falls, Texas.

8 (3) The Northeastern (Will Rogers) Turnpike between Tulsa and  
9 Joplin, Missouri.

10 (4) The Eastern (Indian Nation) Turnpike between Tulsa and  
11 Paris, Texas, including all or any part thereof between McAlester  
12 and the Red River south of Hugo.

13 (5) The Cimarron Turnpike between Tulsa and Interstate Highway  
14 35 north of Perry, including a connection to Stillwater.

15 (6) The Muskogee Turnpike between Broken Arrow and Interstate  
16 Highway 40 west of Webbers Falls.

17 (7) All or any part of an extension of the Muskogee Turnpike,  
18 beginning at a point on Interstate Highway 40 near the present south  
19 terminus of the Muskogee Turnpike, and extending in a southeasterly  
20 direction on an alignment near Stigler, Poteau and Heavener to the  
21 vicinity of the Arkansas State Line to furnish access to Hot  
22 Springs, Texarkana, Shreveport and New Orleans.

1           (8) A tollgate on the Turner Turnpike in the vicinity of  
2 Luther, Oklahoma, and in the vicinity of the intersection of State  
3 Highway 33 and Turner Turnpike in Creek County, Oklahoma, or in the  
4 vicinity of the intersection of State Highway 33 and Turner Turnpike  
5 or U.S. Highway 66 in Creek County, Oklahoma, from any monies  
6 available to the Authority.

7           (9) Add on the Will Rogers Turnpike a northbound automatic  
8 tollgate onto State Highway 28 and a southbound on-ramp from State  
9 Highway 28.

10          (10) A turnpike or any part or parts thereof beginning in the  
11 vicinity of Duncan extending east to the vicinity of the City of  
12 Davis, and extending in a northeasterly direction, by way of the  
13 vicinity of the City of Ada, to a connection in the vicinity of  
14 Henryetta or in the vicinity of the intersection of State Highway 48  
15 and Interstate 40; and a turnpike or any part or parts thereof from  
16 the vicinity of Snyder extending north to the vicinity of Woodward.

17          (11) A turnpike or any part or parts thereof beginning at a  
18 point in the vicinity of Ponca City, or at a point on the Kansas-  
19 Oklahoma state boundary line east of the Arkansas River and west of  
20 the point where Oklahoma State Highway No. 18 intersects said state  
21 boundary line, and extending in a southeasterly direction to a  
22 connection with the Tulsa Urban Expressway System in the general  
23 area of the Port of Catoosa.

1           (12) All or any part of an Oklahoma City toll expressway system  
2 connecting the residential, industrial and State Capitol Complex in  
3 the north part of Oklahoma City with the residential, industrial and  
4 Will Rogers World Airport Complex in the south and southwest parts  
5 of Oklahoma City.

6           (13) A turnpike (The Industrial Parkway) or any part or parts  
7 thereof beginning at a point on the Oklahoma-Kansas state boundary  
8 line between the point where U.S. Highway 66 intersects the boundary  
9 line and the northeast corner of Oklahoma and ending by means of a  
10 connection or connections with Shreveport, Louisiana, and Houston,  
11 Texas, in southeastern Oklahoma and at no point to exceed thirty  
12 (30) miles west of the Missouri or Arkansas border.

13           (14) A turnpike or any part or parts thereof beginning in the  
14 vicinity of Velma or County Line to a point intersecting with  
15 Interstate 35 in the area south of Davis.

16           (15) A turnpike or any part or parts thereof beginning in the  
17 vicinity of Watonga and extending south and/or east to the vicinity  
18 of north and/or west Oklahoma City.

19           (16) A tollgate on the Will Rogers Turnpike near the  
20 intersection of State Highway 137 and the Will Rogers Turnpike,  
21 located south of Quapaw.

22           (17) A tollgate on the Muskogee Turnpike in the vicinity of  
23 Porter, Oklahoma, a tollgate on the Will Rogers Turnpike in the

1 vicinity of Adair, Oklahoma, a tollgate on the Turner Turnpike in  
2 the vicinity of Luther, Oklahoma, and a tollgate on the H.E. Bailey  
3 Turnpike at Elgin, Oklahoma, from any monies available to the  
4 Authority.

5 (18) A tollgate on the Turner Turnpike in the vicinity of  
6 Wellston, Oklahoma, from any monies available to the Authority.

7 (19) A tollgate on the Muskogee Turnpike in the vicinity of  
8 Brushy Mountain, Oklahoma, and in the vicinity of Elm Grove,  
9 Oklahoma, from any monies available to the Authority.

10 (20) All or any part of an Oklahoma City Outer Loop expressway  
11 system beginning in the vicinity of I-35 and the Turner Turnpike and  
12 extending west into Canadian County and then south to I-40; and then  
13 south and east to I-35 in the vicinity of Moore and Norman; and then  
14 extending east and north to I-40 east of Tinker Field; and then  
15 extending north to the Turner Turnpike to complete the Outer Loop.

16 (21) All or any part of the Tulsa south bypass expressway  
17 system beginning in the vicinity of the Turner Turnpike near Sapulpa  
18 and extending south and east to U.S. 75 in the vicinity of 96th  
19 Street to 121st Street; and then east across the Arkansas River to a  
20 connection with the Mingo Valley Expressway; and then south and/or  
21 east to a point on the Tulsa-Wagoner County Line near 131st street  
22 south in the city of Broken Arrow.

1           (22) A new turnpike or any part thereof from near the west gate  
2 of the Will Rogers Turnpike south to the west end of south Tulsa  
3 Turnpike at the Tulsa-Wagoner County Line.

4           (23) A new turnpike or any parts thereof from the vicinity of  
5 the connection between State Highway 33 and U.S. 69 easterly to the  
6 Arkansas State Line.

7           (24) A four-lane extension of the Muskogee Turnpike from  
8 Interstate Highway 40 west of Webbers Falls to the Poteau vicinity.

9           (25) A new turnpike or any part or parts thereof beginning at a  
10 point in the vicinity of northwest Tulsa, and extending in a  
11 northwesterly direction, by means of a connection or connections  
12 with the cities of Pawhuska and Newkirk, to a point intersecting in  
13 the vicinity of US Highway No. 77 and the Kansas State Line.

14           (26) A full access interchange on the Indian Nation Turnpike  
15 south of Interstate 40, in the vicinity of Henryetta, Oklahoma, and  
16 in the vicinity of the proposed theme park, museum or an industrial  
17 facility which qualifies for the Oklahoma Quality Jobs Program Act,  
18 from any monies available to the Authority.

19           (27) A new turnpike beginning at a point directly west of the  
20 Arkansas line and four-laning Highway 70 from that point to the  
21 farthest western reach of Highway 70 creating a southern route  
22 through Oklahoma.

1           (28) A new turnpike and bridge or any parts thereof from a  
2 point in the vicinity of the city of Mustang southerly across the  
3 South Canadian River to the H.E. Bailey Turnpike in the vicinity of  
4 the city of Tuttle; and then easterly across the South Canadian  
5 River to a point in the vicinity of the city of Norman.

6           (29) A new turnpike or any parts thereof beginning at a point  
7 in the vicinity of the city of Altus and extending in a  
8 northwesterly direction to a point in the vicinity of the city of  
9 Sayre.

10          (30) A new turnpike or any parts thereof beginning at a point  
11 in the vicinity of the city of Enid and extending in a westerly  
12 direction to a point in the vicinity of the city of Woodward.

13          (31) An on- and off-ramp or any parts thereof at Fletcher,  
14 Oklahoma, in the vicinity of the Interstate 44 and State Highway 277  
15 intersection. Any existing on- or off-ramp or any parts thereof in  
16 the vicinity of Fletcher, Oklahoma, shall not be removed and shall  
17 be maintained pursuant to Section 1701 et seq. of this title.

18          (32) A new bridge crossing the Arkansas River in the vicinity  
19 of South Yale Avenue and South Yale Place in Tulsa County. This  
20 project shall commence upon a determination by the Oklahoma  
21 Transportation Authority that such bridge shall be self-sufficient  
22 at some point over a thirty-year time period from the toll charges  
23 associated with the bridge project.

1 All access roads, interchanges, or lead roads connecting such  
2 turnpikes with existing highways must be built by funds furnished by  
3 the Authority.

4 The minimum and maximum wages for the construction of the roads,  
5 highways and projects provided for in Sections 1701 through 1734 of  
6 this title shall be in accordance with the schedules of wages used  
7 or adopted by the Commission in construction of state highways.

8 The Authority is hereby authorized to enter into contracts or  
9 agreements with agencies and instrumentalities of other states or  
10 the national government for construction, maintenance and operation  
11 of interstate turnpikes or highways.

12 The Authority is hereby required to construct and install  
13 automatic tollgates on the Will Rogers Turnpike at State Highway No.  
14 28 near Adair.

15 (f) To issue turnpike revenue bonds of the Authority, payable  
16 solely from revenues, including the revenues accruing to the trust  
17 fund created by Sections 1701 through 1734 of this title, for the  
18 purpose of paying all or any part of the cost of any one or more  
19 turnpike projects. Provided that any bonds issued for the  
20 construction of the proposed turnpike referred to in subparagraphs  
21 (10), (20), (21) and (22) of paragraph (e) of this section shall be  
22 issued as one issue for all four of the proposed turnpikes and shall  
23 be financed, constructed and operated under one bond indenture.

1 (g) To fix and revise from time to time tolls for the use of  
2 any turnpike projects.

3 Any common carrier having authority at the time of opening any  
4 turnpike project to operate upon a highway approximately paralleling  
5 the turnpike project shall be granted without further showing  
6 authority to operate over the turnpike project to all municipalities  
7 which such carrier is serving at the time the turnpike project is  
8 opened to traffic. But nothing herein shall be construed as  
9 granting any new operation rights to any common carriers.

10 (h) To acquire, hold, and dispose of real and personal property  
11 in the exercise of its powers and the performance of its duties.

12 (i) To acquire in the name of the Authority by purchase or  
13 otherwise on such terms and conditions and in such manner as it may  
14 deem proper, or by exercise of the right of condemnation in manner  
15 hereinafter provided, such public or private lands, including public  
16 parks, playgrounds, or reservations, or parts thereof or rights  
17 therein, rights-of-way, property, rights, easements, and interests,  
18 as it may deem necessary for carrying out the provisions of Sections  
19 1701 through 1734 of this title; provided, that all public property  
20 damaged in carrying out the powers granted by Sections 1701 through  
21 1734 of this title shall be restored or repaired and placed in its  
22 original condition as nearly as practicable.

1           (j) To designate, except as is provided for herein, the  
2 location, and establish, limit and control such points of ingress to  
3 and egress from each turnpike project as may be necessary or  
4 desirable in the judgment of the Authority to insure the proper  
5 operation and maintenance of such project, and to prohibit entrance  
6 to such project from any point or points not so designated.

7           (k) To make and enter into all contracts and agreements  
8 necessary or incidental to the performance of its duties and the  
9 execution of its powers, and to employ consulting engineers,  
10 attorneys, accountants, construction and financial experts,  
11 superintendents, managers, and such other employees and agents as  
12 may be necessary in its judgment, and to fix their compensation;  
13 provided, that all such expenses shall be payable solely from the  
14 proceeds of turnpike revenue bonds issued under the provisions of  
15 Sections 1701 through 1734 of this title or from revenues; provided,  
16 further, no attorney employed by the Authority, nor any member of  
17 any law firm of which he may be connected, shall ever be paid any  
18 fee or compensation for any special or extraordinary services.

19           (l) To receive and accept from any federal agency grants for or  
20 in aid of the construction of any turnpike project, provided, the  
21 acceptance of such grants will not reduce the amount of federal aid  
22 for the construction, repair, or maintenance of farm-to-market roads  
23 and other highways and bridges in this state; and to receive and

1 accept aid or contributions from any source of either money,  
2 property, labor, or other things of value, to be held, used, and  
3 applied only for the purposes for which such grants and  
4 contributions may be made.

5 (m) To adopt such rules, and to do any and all things necessary  
6 to comply with rules, regulations, or requirements of the Bureau of  
7 Public Roads, Multistate Economic Development Regional Commission,  
8 as defined in Sections 1151 through 1153, inclusive, of Title 74 of  
9 the Oklahoma Statutes, Ozarka Region Commission or any other federal  
10 agency administering any law enacted by the Congress of the United  
11 States to aid or encourage the construction of highways.

12 (n) To do all things necessary or convenient to carry out the  
13 powers expressly granted in Sections 1701 through 1734 of this  
14 title. The design standards for all paving shall comply with the  
15 design standards of the American Association of State Highway and  
16 Transportation Officials as modified by the Oklahoma Department of  
17 Transportation. All contracts for construction work on turnpike  
18 projects shall be let to the lowest responsible bidder, or bidders,  
19 after notice by publication in a newspaper published in the county  
20 where the work is to be done in two consecutive weekly issues of the  
21 newspaper. In all cases where more than eight (8) miles of  
22 construction is let at the same time, such advertisement shall  
23 provide for bids on sections of the turnpike not to exceed eight (8)

1 miles. Subject to the following restrictions and limitations, the  
2 Authority shall, when contracting for construction work, divide such  
3 work into paving projects, bridge projects, including underpasses  
4 and overpasses, and earthmoving or miscellaneous projects, according  
5 to the type of work to be done. Each project shall be let under a  
6 separate contract or contracts and no contract or project shall  
7 include more than one of such types of construction work. Each  
8 contract for construction work shall contain a provision that ninety  
9 percent (90%) of all labor employed on the project shall be  
10 residents of Oklahoma. However, contracts for bridges may include  
11 earthwork and structures for the approaches thereto.

12 (o) It shall be unlawful for any member, officer or employee of  
13 the Authority to transact with the Authority, either directly or  
14 indirectly, any business for profit of such member, officer, or  
15 employee; and any person, firm, or corporation knowingly  
16 participating therein shall be equally liable for violation of this  
17 provision.

18 The term "business for profit" shall include, but not be limited  
19 to, the acceptance or payment of any fee, commission, gift, or  
20 consideration to such member, officer, or employee.

21 Violation of this provision shall constitute a felony punishable  
22 by incarceration in the State Penitentiary for a term not to exceed  
23 five (5) years or a fine of not less than Five Hundred Dollars

1 (\$500.00) and not more than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00), or  
2 both such imprisonment and fine.

3 (p) In the event of a national emergency, the Authority,  
4 subject to any vested rights or claims, may enter into contracts  
5 with the federal government or any authorized agency thereof to  
6 allow the federal government or agency thereof to use such turnpikes  
7 partly or exclusively during the existence of such emergency,  
8 provided, that the federal government agrees in such contract to  
9 pay, during the term of such contract, an amount sufficient, when  
10 added to any tolls collected, to meet all operating and maintenance  
11 expenses, interest payments, and the minimum sinking fund and  
12 reserve requirements of the trust agreement for the turnpike covered  
13 by the contract.

14 (q) All meetings of the Authority shall be open public  
15 meetings, and all records shall be public records, except when  
16 considering personnel or litigation.

17 SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 69 O.S. 2001, Section 1706, as  
18 amended by Section 3, Chapter 419, O.S.L. 2004 (69 O.S. Supp. 2004,  
19 Section 1706), is amended to read as follows:

20 Section 1706. A. The Oklahoma ~~Transportation~~ Turnpike  
21 Authority may and it shall be its duty to construct grade  
22 separations at intersections of any turnpike project with state and  
23 federal highways, and to change and adjust the lines and grades of

1 such highways so as to accommodate the same to the design of such  
2 grade separation. The Authority may construct grade separations at  
3 intersections of turnpike projects with county highways and city  
4 streets and it shall construct grade separations at intersections of  
5 any turnpike project with county highways used as mail or school bus  
6 routes, or section lines which are well used and are necessary for  
7 convenience of people living in these areas. The cost of such grade  
8 separations and any damage incurred in changing and adjusting the  
9 lines and grades of such highways shall be ascertained and paid by  
10 the Authority as a part of the cost of such turnpike project.

11 Except for routine surface maintenance, the Authority shall maintain  
12 the structure and surface of bridges and overpasses where a county  
13 road crosses over or under a turnpike.

14 B. If the Authority shall find it necessary to change the  
15 location of any portion of any state or county highway or street of  
16 a municipality, it shall cause the same to be reconstructed in  
17 substantially the same type and in as good condition as the original  
18 highway. Provided, however, that all changes and adjustments of the  
19 lines and grades of state highways shall be subject to the approval  
20 of the Transportation Commission. The cost of such reconstruction  
21 and any damage incurred in changing the location of any such highway  
22 or street shall be ascertained and paid by the Authority as a part  
23 of the cost of such turnpike project.

1 C. In addition to the foregoing powers, the Authority and its  
2 authorized agents and employees may enter upon any lands, waters,  
3 and premises in the state for the purpose of making surveys,  
4 soundings, drillings, and examinations as it may deem necessary or  
5 convenient for the purposes of establishing, locating, relocating,  
6 constructing, and maintaining turnpikes or relocations thereof and  
7 facilities necessary and incidental thereto. Such entry shall not  
8 be deemed a trespass, nor shall an entry for such purpose be deemed  
9 an entry under any condemnation proceedings which may be then  
10 pending; however, notice shall be given to the owner of or person  
11 residing on the premises, personally or by registered mail, at least  
12 ten (10) days prior to such entry. The Authority shall make  
13 reimbursement for any actual damages resulting to such lands,  
14 waters, and premises as a result of such activities. In the event  
15 of disagreement as to the amount of damage, either the person or the  
16 Authority may file a petition with the district court for the  
17 appointment of commissioners to appraise the damages and proceed to  
18 have the same determined as in condemnation proceedings.

19 D. The State of Oklahoma hereby consents to the use of all  
20 lands owned by it, including lands lying under water, which are  
21 deemed by the Authority to be necessary for the construction or  
22 operation of any turnpike project; and the State of Oklahoma shall  
23 be paid reasonable compensation for the land or property used, such

1 compensation to be determined in the manner now provided by law for  
2 condemnation proceedings.

3 SECTION 6. AMENDATORY Section 2, Chapter 206, O.S.L.  
4 2003 (69 O.S. Supp. 2004, Section 1717.1), is amended to read as  
5 follows:

6 Section 1717.1 No turnpike project shall be transferred from  
7 the Oklahoma ~~Transportation~~ Turnpike Authority to the state highway  
8 system except as follows:

9 1. Pursuant to the applicable provisions of Section 1717 of  
10 ~~Title 69 of the Oklahoma Statutes~~ this title; or

11 2. Pursuant to the approval of the transfer by the Legislature  
12 as expressed in a concurrent resolution.

13 SECTION 7. This act shall become effective November 1, 2005.
