12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

13 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
14 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 41.5v of Title 62, unless there
15 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

16 A. The Office of State Finance shall create a standard security
17 risk assessment for state agency information technology systems that
18 complies with the International Organization for Standardization
19 (ISO) and the International Electrotechnical Commission (IEC)
20 Information Technology - Code of Practice for Security Management
21 (ISO/IEC 17799). The final assessment report shall identify,
22 prioritize, and document information security vulnerabilities for
23 each of the state agencies assessed.

24 B. Each state agency that has an information technology system
25 shall conduct an information security risk assessment to identify

1 vulnerabilities associated with the information system on an annual
2 basis. The information security risk assessment shall be completed
3 by the first day of December of each year. Failure to comply may
4 result in funding being withheld from the agency. The state
5 agencies shall use either the standard security risk assessment
6 created by the Office of State Finance or a third-party risk
7 assessment meeting the ISO/IEC 17799 and approved by the Office of
8 State Finance. The Office of State Finance shall select at least
9 two (2) firms for agencies to conduct the information security risk
10 assessment.

11 C. The Office of State Finance shall report the results of the
12 assessments required under this section to the Governor, the Speaker
13 of the House of Representatives, and the President Pro Tempore of
14 the Senate by the first day of January of each year.

15 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2006.

16 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
17 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
18 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
19 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
