Senate Bill No. 1019

SENATE BILL NO. 1019 - By: GUMM of the Senate and ROAN of the House.

An Act relating to waters and water rights; amending 82 O.S. 2001, Section 1452, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 305, O.S.L. 2003 (82 O.S. Supp. 2005, Section 1452), which relates to scenic rivers; expanding designated scenic river areas; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 82 O.S. 2001, Section 1452, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 305, O.S.L. 2003 (82 O.S. Supp. 2005, Section 1452), is amended to read as follows:

Section 1452. A. The Oklahoma Legislature finds that some of the free-flowing streams and rivers of Oklahoma possess such unique natural scenic beauty, water conservation, fish, wildlife and outdoor recreational values of present and future benefit to the people of the state that it is the policy of the Legislature to preserve these areas for the benefit of the people of Oklahoma. For this purpose there are hereby designated certain "scenic river areas" to be preserved as a part of Oklahoma's diminishing resource of free-flowing rivers and streams.

B. The areas of the state designated as "scenic river areas" shall include:

- 1 1. The Flint Creek and the Illinois River above the confluence
2 of the Barren Fork Creek in Cherokee, Adair and Delaware Counties;
- 3 2. The Barren Fork Creek in Adair and Cherokee Counties from
4 the present alignment of Highway 59 West to the Illinois River;
- 5 3. The Upper Mountain Fork River above the 600-foot elevation
6 level of Broken Bow Reservoir in McCurtain and LeFlore Counties;
- 7 4. Big Lee's Creek, sometimes referred to as Lee Creek, located
8 in Sequoyah County, above the 420-foot MSL elevation, excluding that
9 portion necessary for a dam to be built in the State of Arkansas
10 with a crest elevation of no more than the 420-foot MSL elevation.
11 The Oklahoma Water Resources Board shall make such classifications,
12 designations or adjustments to Oklahoma's water quality standards as
13 required to allow the impoundment of water by said dam; ~~and~~
- 14 5. Little Lee's Creek, sometimes referred to as Little Lee
15 Creek, located in Adair and Sequoyah Counties, beginning
16 approximately four (4) miles east-southeast of Stilwell, Oklahoma,
17 and ending at its conjunction with Big Lee's Creek approximately two
18 (2) miles southwest of Short, Oklahoma; and
- 19 6. The Blue River and tributaries located in Pontotoc and
20 Johnston counties.

21 C. The term "scenic river area" as used in the Scenic Rivers
22 Act is defined as the stream or river and the public use and access
23 areas located within the area designated.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2006.
