Senate Bill No. 1296

SENATE BILL NO. 1296 - By: SHURDEN of the Senate and WALKER of the House.

An Act relating to game and fish; amending 29 O.S. 2001, Sections 5-401, as amended by Section 12, Chapter 160, O.S.L. 2003, and 5-405 (29 O.S. Supp. 2005, Section 5-401), which relate to powers of the Wildlife Conservation Commission regarding seasons; modifying powers of the Wildlife Conservation Commission; limiting open season on mountain lions to specified month; authorizing open season on otters; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 29 O.S. 2001, Section 5-401, as amended by Section 12, Chapter 160, O.S.L. 2003 (29 O.S. Supp. 2005, Section 5-401), is amended to read as follows:

Section 5-401. A. The Wildlife Conservation Commission is authorized to declare an open season on wildlife in any counties or parts of counties of this state where, in the judgment of ~~said~~ the Commission, such wildlife exists in sufficient quantity to warrant such open season, and such open season shall be declared by Commission resolution not less than ten (10) days before the season is opened.

B. The Commission may designate any two (2) consecutive days after the open season declared for hunting deer to be senior citizen's hunting days. During those two (2) days only legal

1 residents of Oklahoma who are sixty-four (64) years of age or older
2 may hunt deer provided the person has a valid license as otherwise
3 provided by law.

4 C. Open season declared for hunting mountain lions shall be
5 limited to the month of December.

6 D. The Commission is further authorized to prescribe rules
7 necessary to the proper conduct and policing of such open season,
8 the amount and kind of wildlife that may be taken, and the dates and
9 time limits of such season.

10 ~~D.~~ E. The Commission is further authorized to require any
11 person participating in ~~said~~ such open season or hunting in open
12 areas during open season to procure, under rules prescribed by the
13 Commission, a special permit or license to participate in such
14 season or hunt in such areas during open season and to charge
15 residents not to exceed Twenty Dollars (\$20.00), nonresidents not to
16 exceed Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00) and further providing that Five
17 Dollars (\$5.00) of this fee shall be set aside for compensation to
18 Oklahoma surface holders participating in the Acres for Wildlife
19 Program at a rate to be determined by the Wildlife Conservation
20 Commission. No exemptions shall be permitted.

21 ~~E.~~ F. Open seasons, closed seasons, bag limits, catch limits,
22 possession limits and territorial limitations set forth in the
23 statutes of this state, pertaining to wildlife of every sort, are

1 hereby declared to be based on the existence of a normal population
2 of such species of wildlife, compatible with and not damaging to the
3 proper agricultural use of the lands of the state.

4 ~~F.~~ G. Such seasons, catch limits, bag limits, possession limits
5 and territorial limitations as set by statute shall prevail and be
6 in full force and effect for each and every species of wildlife to
7 which they pertain so long as the population or numbers of such
8 wildlife species remain normal or are not damaging or endangering
9 crops or proper agricultural use of the lands of the state.

10 H. The Commission in session, and after having given ten (10)
11 days' public notice of such meeting being called and the purpose of
12 such meeting, the species of wildlife to be considered and the
13 reasons therefor, shall have the right to determine if there does or
14 does not exist a normal population of the wildlife species under
15 consideration, which does or does not endanger the crops of the
16 state or of any certain areas, or the agricultural use of the lands
17 therein. In the event the consideration is other than statewide,
18 the Commission shall meet at the most convenient place to the people
19 of the area in the area being considered. All meetings shall be
20 open to the public and proper records of those appearing and
21 testifying shall be made. If the Commission, after hearing and
22 after investigation, finds that the populations of the wildlife
23 species under hearing are not normal or that they are not compatible

1 to the agricultural use of the lands or are damaging or endangering
2 the farm crops of the area, they shall, by administrative order,
3 make the necessary changes by either extending, shortening, opening
4 or closing such seasons, and change such bag limits, catch limits
5 and possession limits, and regulate methods or devices for taking,
6 killing or capturing of the wildlife species affected in any area or
7 areas covered by the notice of meeting and hearing, except as
8 otherwise set by the Legislature.

9 ~~H.~~ I. Such administrative order shall take effect after
10 publication in at least one newspaper of general state circulation,
11 or in a newspaper having circulation in the territory affected. A
12 copy of all such orders shall, before publication, be filed with the
13 Secretary of State, and such order shall not be construed as
14 authorizing the Commission to change any penalty for violating any
15 game law or regulation or change the amount of any license
16 established by the Legislature.

17 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 29 O.S. 2001, Section 5-405, is
18 amended to read as follows:

19 Section 5-405. A. Except as otherwise provided, no person may
20 hunt, kill, capture or otherwise take or destroy any furbearer,
21 except from December 1 to January 31, both dates inclusive.

22 B. ~~No person may take otter at any time.~~

1 ~~E.~~ Any person who takes a pelt or pelts during the season shall
2 have ten (10) working days after the close of the season to sell or
3 dispose of the pelts or to provide written notification to the
4 Department of Wildlife Conservation that the person intends to hold
5 the pelts for later sale. Written notification shall be made on a
6 form prescribed by the Department.

7 ~~D.~~ C. Nothing contained in these provisions shall prevent the
8 killing of furbearers actually found destroying livestock, poultry
9 or exotic livestock, nor the running or chasing of fox, bobcat and
10 raccoon with dogs for sport only. For purposes of this section the
11 term "exotic livestock" means commercially raised exotic livestock
12 including animals of the families bovidae, cervidae and
13 antilocapridae or birds of the ratite group.

14 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2006.

15 SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
16 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
17 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
18 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
