Senate Bill No. 29

SENATE BILL NO. 29 - By: GARRISON of the Senate and HILLIARD of the House.

An Act relating to counties and county officers; amending 19 O.S. 2001, Section 178.1, which relates to inventory; increasing cap on certain inventory; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 19 O.S. 2001, Section 178.1, is amended to read as follows:

Section 178.1 The board of county commissioners in each county of this state shall take, or cause to be taken, an inventory of all working tools, apparatus, machinery and equipment belonging to the county or leased or otherwise let to it or to any department thereof, other than that which is affixed to and made a part of lands and buildings, the cost of which as to each complete working unit thereof is more than ~~Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00)~~ Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$750.00), and thereafter maintain or cause to be maintained a continuous inventory record thereof and of like tools, apparatus, machinery and equipment purchased, leased or otherwise coming into the custody of the county or of any office, board, department, commission or any or either thereof, and the disposition thereof whether sold, exchanged, leased or let where

1 authorized by statute, junked, strayed or stolen, and biennially
2 thereafter, or oftener in event of death, resignation or removal of
3 an elective officer with a term, to verify or cause to be verified
4 by count and report of the same as of the end of a term of office
5 and as part and parcel of the accounting required by law of a
6 retiring or re-elected officer, and, as to appointive heads of
7 departments amenable directly to the board of county commissioners
8 and as to quasi-governmental boards and commissions such as free
9 fair boards, hospital boards and the like, the same shall be as of
10 the last business day immediately preceding the day certain
11 commencing a new term of the board of county commissioners; all in
12 the manner as provided by law.

13 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2005.

14 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
15 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
16 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
17 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
