

An Act relating to firearms; creating the Stand Your Ground Law; amending 21 O.S. 2001, Section 1289.25, which relates to physical or deadly force against intruder; creating presumption that reasonable fear of death or great bodily harm exists under certain circumstances; providing exceptions; authorizing the use of certain force under certain circumstances; creating presumption that a person acts with intent to use force or violence under specified circumstances; clarifying scope of criminal and civil immunity; providing exception when force is used against a peace officer; defining term; authorizing use of certain investigative procedures; prohibiting arrest for use of force unless probable cause determined; requiring certain costs be awarded upon a finding of immunity; defining terms; providing for noncodification; and providing an effective date.
