HOUSE BILL 1675

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to schools; requiring school districts to display in certain places the Bill of Rights of the United States Constitution and the Bill of Rights of the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma; defining certain term; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 24-112.1 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The board of education of every school district in the state shall be required to display in each classroom, school auditorium, and school cafeteria under their supervision the Bill of Rights of the United States Constitution and the Bill of Rights of the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma. For purposes of the section, "classroom" means any room of a public school where instruction takes place.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2005.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
