HOUSE BILL 1900

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to schools; directing the State Board of Education to establish a School District Level Student Data Tracking System Pilot Program; stating purpose of the Pilot Program; stating objectives of the Pilot Program; providing for selection of school districts for the Pilot Program; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3-161 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The State Board of Education is directed to establish a School District Level Student Data Tracking System Pilot Program. The purpose of the Pilot Program shall be to provide for the development and implementation of a school district level student data management system that horizontally integrates and provides relationships between critical student data and school district data. The Pilot Program shall incorporate the following objectives:

1. Student level accreditation, based on multiperformance measures;

2. Develop data aggregation systems that automate state reporting requirements;

3. Develop data warehousing systems to archive historical information and provide for longitudinal analysis of data;

4. Develop secure data delivery systems to students, administrators, teachers, parents and the community; and

5. Provide for teacher training on data-based decision making.

B. Ten public school districts shall be selected to participate in the Pilot Program. Two school districts shall be selected from each of the four quadrants of the state. One school district shall be selected from each of the two largest counties in the state based on populations. The Board may establish criteria, including but not limited to technical capacity and knowledge criteria, that school districts shall be required to meet in order to qualify to participate in the Pilot Program. The Board shall select the participating school districts by September 1, 2005.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2005.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
