HOUSE BILL 2779

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to agriculture; requiring purebred auctioneers to be licensed; specifying requirements and procedures for licensure; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 9-133.1 of Title 2, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. It shall be unlawful for any person to do business as a purebred auctioneer without first obtaining a valid license issued by the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry and paying the license fee.

B. To be licensed as a purebred auctioneer, an individual must:

1. Submit a written application on a form approved by the Department along with the required fee; and

2. Have satisfactorily completed two (2) hours of training in purebred auctioneering at an institution or by an individual approved by the Department.

C. All purebred auctioneer licenses are in effect for five (5) years and may be renewed by application and approval by the Department.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2006.
