HOUSE BILL 2803

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to abortion; ordering a legislative referendum pursuant to the Oklahoma Constitution; directing that provisions of certain prohibited act become effective upon issuance of certain decision by United States Supreme Court; providing for codification; providing ballot title; and directing filing.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to Section 3 of Article V of the Oklahoma Constitution, there is hereby ordered the following legislative referendum which shall be filed with the Secretary of State and addressed to the Governor of the state, who shall submit the same to the people for their approval or rejection at the next General Election.

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 864 of Title 21, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The provisions of Section 861 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes shall become effective upon the cessation of the United States Supreme Court decision of Roe v. Wade, 410 U.S. 113, upon certification by the Oklahoma Attorney General.

SECTION 3. The Ballot Title for the proposed act shall be in the following form:

THE GIST OF THE PROPOSITION IS AS FOLLOWS:

This act creates a new law within the Oklahoma Statutes. It requires the provisions of Section 861 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes to become effective upon the cessation of the United States Supreme Court decision of Roe v. Wade upon certification by the Oklahoma Attorney General.

SECTION 4. The Chief Clerk of the Oklahoma House of Representatives, immediately after the passage of this act, shall prepare and file one copy thereof, including the Ballot Title set forth in SECTION 3 hereof, with the Secretary of State and one copy with the Attorney General.
