AS INTRODUCED

A Resolution memorializing the Congress of the United States of America to enact meaningful, but fair and equitable, legislation to secure United States borders and to provide for immigration law reform; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, the security of this nation is of utmost concern to American citizens; and

WHEREAS, to ensure national security, it is imperative that the federal government take steps to provide meaningful border control and immigration law reform; and

WHEREAS, to achieve these goals, federal legislation must be enacted that first protects the rights of United States citizens, but does so in a manner that is fair and equitable and that upholds this nation's tradition as a nation founded on principles of due process and equal treatment under the law, regardless of race, gender, creed, or national origin; and

WHEREAS, we look to the President and the Congress of the United States to provide workable solutions to the many problems currently facing this nation because of the illegal immigration issue; and

WHEREAS, it is imperative that the President and the Congress provide the aggressive leadership that this nation's citizens expect and deserve so that real border control and immigration law reform occur.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 2ND EXTRAORDINARY SESSION OF THE 50TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

THAT the Oklahoma House of Representatives hereby memorializes the Congress of the United States of America to enact meaningful, but fair and equitable, legislation to secure United States borders and to provide for immigration law reform that establishes workable solutions to combat the problems caused by illegal entry and residence in the United States, while protecting the rights of both citizens and noncitizens.

THAT copies of this resolution be dispatched to the Oklahoma Congressional Delegation, the Clerk of the United States House of Representatives, and the Secretary of the United States Senate.
