AS INTRODUCED

A Resolution honoring North Carolina Assistant Coach and native Oklahoman Joe Holladay on the North Carolina Tar Heels 2005 NCAA National Championship; offering best wishes and congratulations; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, University of North Carolina assistant coach, Joe Holladay, a native Oklahoman, a 1969 University of Oklahoma graduate with a degree in history and a standout guard and team captain for the Sooners from 1967-69, has succeeded in garnering respect and admiration for his dedication to the sport of basketball and to the North Carolina Tar Heels; and

WHEREAS, Joe Holladay earned a master's degree in counseling in 1975 from East Central University in Oklahoma, and went on to become a basketball coach in the Oklahoma cities of Norman, Bartlesville, Tulsa, and Lindsay; and

WHEREAS, Joe Holladay, an outstanding baseball player, was selected by the Chicago White Sox in the Major League Baseball Draft, was inducted into the Oklahoma High School Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 1998, and in 2002 was an inaugural inductee into the Oklahoma Basketball Coaches Association Hall of Fame; and

WHEREAS, Joe Holladay coached our very own District 46 State Representative Doug Miller as a basketball player for the Tigers of Norman High School; and

WHEREAS, Joe Holladay, early in his career as a high school basketball coach at Norman High School, coached against District 101 State Representative Gary Banz, who was a coach for the Putnam City Pirates.
