AS INTRODUCED

A Resolution acknowledging the Hispanic population for their contributions to the State of Oklahoma, praising their achievements; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, the Hispanic population in the State of Oklahoma has established a diversity of which we can all be proud, such as the Alma Folklórica de Oklahoma which enables Oklahomans to learn through the arts about the Hispanic cultural heritage and to present that heritage through folkloric ballet; and

WHEREAS, the contribution made by the Hispanic population to Oklahoma are varied and numbered and each contributes a significant involvement in the communities in which they live; and

WHEREAS, the Hispanic population that accounts for 5.2 percent of the population in Oklahoma has positively effected the economy, education, and cultural diversity in our state; and

WHEREAS, the hardworking and dedicated Hispanic population contributes over 5,000 businesses ranging from computer technology and construction, entertainment, professional, and educational, to health care and food service, employs over 8,000 and contribute annual sales of over a billion dollars; and

WHEREAS, the Hispanic population has contributed to and joined with the State of Oklahoma in its concern for National Security and the economy; and

WHEREAS, the future of Oklahoma's economy relies on the Hispanic population as well as all of its citizen; and

WHEREAS, the hardworking and dedicated Hispanic young men and women exercise their belief in patriotism by joining the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines and National Guard by fighting for the freedoms that are the building blocks of the State of Oklahoma and the nation; and

WHEREAS, the Hispanic population has established a faith community that is built on family, social and moral values and the struggle for freedom on which this country was founded; and

WHEREAS, the Hispanic population in the State of Oklahoma has established neighborhoods that thrive under the guidance of faith and reliance on the family, social, and moral values that are part of their culture and the foundation of the culture of the State of Oklahoma.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 50TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:
