SENATE BILL 1461

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to schools; directing State Board of Education to develop certain program; specifying capabilities of program; directing Board to select certain pilot sites to test program during 2006-07 school year; directing each school district to administer certain assessment to certain students beginning in 2007-08 school year; authorizing Board to delay implementation upon certain determination; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 24-100b of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The State Board of Education shall develop a fitness assessment software program customized for Oklahoma schools that has the capability to track various measurements of student fitness, including body mass index, aerobic endurance, strength and flexibility. The software program shall have the capability of creating confidential reports for parents that include explanations of the data and suggestions for appropriate actions that may be taken to improve the fitness level of the student. The Board shall select a number of elementary school sites to pilot the software during the 2006-07 school year. Pilot sites shall test all students in grades three, four, and five at the end of the spring semester.

Beginning with the 2007-08 school year, each school district shall administer the assessment to each student enrolled in grades three, four, and five, unless the State Board of Education

determines the implementation of the assessment requires a one-year delay.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2006.
