SENATE BILL 1486

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to open records; requiring state agencies to provide electronic access to certain publications; setting forth procedures therefor; providing exceptions thereto; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 24A.30 of Title 51, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A state agency shall make each publication of the state agency, created after November 1, 2006, which qualifies as a record pursuant to the provisions of Section 24A.3 of this title, is in excess of ten (10) pages in length and of which the agency makes ten (10) or more copies, available to the public in an electronic format. If the state agency has a web site, such publications shall be made available on the web site free of charge for viewing. A state agency which is required to provide copies of a publication of the state agency to certain entities or persons shall satisfy the requirement by providing the intended recipient with written notice of the contents of the publication and all information necessary for the recipient to obtain an electronic copy of the publication, unless a paper copy of the publication is requested from the recipient. A state agency may respond to a request for a copy of a publication by sending the requestor a copy in an electronic format. If a member of the public requests a paper copy of a publication of

a state agency, a paper copy shall be made available subject to the provisions of Section 24A.5 of this title.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2006.
