SENATE BILL 426

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to public health and safety; defining contraception; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-744 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Contraception shall not be subject to or governed by the provisions of Sections 1-730 through 1-743 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes. For all purposes, "contraception" means the use of any process, device or method to prevent pregnancy, including steroidal, chemical, physical or barrier or natural or permanent methods for preventing the union of an ovum with the spermatozoon or the subsequent implantation of the fertilized ovum in the uterus.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2005.
