SENATE BILL 699

AS INTRODUCED

An Act relating to schools; directing State Board of Education to require certain physical and health education instruction in elementary schools as a condition of accreditation; directing State Board of Education to adopt rules; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 11-103.9 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Beginning with the 2006-2007 school year, the State Board of Education shall require, as a condition of accreditation, that public elementary schools provide instruction by a certified health and physical education teacher for students in kindergarten through grade five for a minimum of thirty (30) minutes each day, three (3) days per week, for physical activity and a minimum of thirty (30) minutes each day, two (2) days per week, for health education, that is aligned with the Priority Academic Student Skills as adopted by the Board.

B. The State Board of Education shall adopt rules to implement the provisions of this section.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2005.
