RESOLUTION 32

AS INTRODUCED

A Concurrent Resolution relating to the Lincoln Boulevard Renaissance Project Plan; directing the Department of Central Services to update certain plan; directing the Oklahoma Tax Commission in conjunction with other state agencies to examine the feasibility of constructing a new building; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, the Lincoln Boulevard Renaissance Project was designed to improve the Lincoln Boulevard corridor leading to the Oklahoma State Capitol and the project has been ongoing since the late 1990s; and

WHEREAS, the Lincoln Boulevard Renaissance Project Plan was developed by the Department of Central Services in 1997 and has never been updated; and

WHEREAS, land acquisition, environmental remediation and beautification were the primary goals of the project and as of this date these three essential steps have largely been completed; and

WHEREAS, the key final stage of the project, which is to use the land the state has purchased, has not been implemented.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 50TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the Oklahoma Legislature directs the Department of Central Services to update the Lincoln Boulevard Renaissance Project Plan.

THAT the Oklahoma Legislature directs the Oklahoma Tax Commission in conjunction with the Department of Central Services, the Department of Commerce and other interested state agencies to examine the feasibility of constructing a new building upon state-owned land within the Lincoln Boulevard Renaissance Project in Oklahoma City. A one-stop business center which would issue licenses and permits and handle other regulatory business matters would be included within the building.

THAT a copy of this resolution be distributed to the Chairman of the Oklahoma Tax Commission, the Director of the Department of Central Services and the Director of the Department of Commerce.
