AS INTRODUCED

A Resolution welcoming the Sequoyah High School girls and boys basketball teams to the Oklahoma State Capitol; congratulating and commending them for their championship season; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, Sequoyah High School in Tahlequah, Oklahoma, is an Indian Boarding School operated through a grant from the Cherokee Nation and is regionally and state accredited. Sequoyah High School originated in 1871, sponsored by the Cherokee National Council. In November 1985 the Cherokee Nation resumed the operation of the high school from the Bureau of Indian Affairs; and

WHEREAS, the Sequoyah High School Lady Indians girls basketball team won the 2005 District, Regional, Area and State Class 3A championships with a 26-2 record, an average margin of victory of 21.15 points, and was the top-scoring team in State Class 3A high school girls basketball in Oklahoma; and

WHEREAS, the Sequoyah High School Indians boys basketball team won the 2005 District, Regional, and Area championships, in addition to being State Class 3A runner-up, with an overall 23-5 record.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 50TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

THAT the Oklahoma State Senate welcomes the Sequoyah High School girls and boys basketball teams to the Oklahoma State Capitol.

THAT the Oklahoma State Senate congratulates the girls team for winning the State Class 3A championship and commends the boys team for their championship season.

THAT a copy of this resolution be distributed to Sequoyah High School Superintendent Gina Stanley, Principal Tony Dearman, Athletic Director and boys basketball coach Larry Grigg, boys basketball assistant coach Johnny Dreyer, Lady Indians basketball coach Bill Nobles, and assistant coach Jay Herrin.
