Representative Ingmire moved to amend **HB 1986**, Page 2, Section 3, Line 22 through Page 3, Line 1 by deleting the language “is redeemable in cash for its cash value, or”.

Representative Ingmire moved to amend his amendment, Page 2, Section 3, Line 22 through Page 3, Lines 1-2 by deleting subsection B which reads as follows, and relettering subsequent subsections, which amendment was declared adopted:

“B. Any gift certificate or gift card sold after November 1, 2005, is redeemable in cash for its cash value, or subject to replacement with a new gift certificate or gift card at no cost to the purchaser or holder.”

“C. If there is no legal dispute about the legitimacy of the child before the child reaches two (2) years of age, the parental rights of the father, as established by subsection B of this section, shall not be terminated without his consent.”

Representative Dorman moved that **HB 1923** be advanced from General Order, which motion was declared adopted.

By unanimous consent, upon request of Representative Dorman, **HB 1923** was considered engrossed and placed on Third Reading and Final Passage.
