Second Regular Session of the Fiftieth Legislature of the State of Oklahoma

Forty-ninth Legislative Day, Monday, May 1, 2006

The House was called to order by Speaker Pro Tempore Winchester.

The roll was called with 98 Members present.

The following Members were excused: Askins, Nance, Young.—3.

The Speaker Pro Tempore declared a quorum present.

Prayer was offered by Pastor Rodney James, Sequoyah Hills Baptist Church, Tulsa. Pastor James was sponsored this week by Representative Gilbert.

Upon motion of Representative Miller (Doug), Pastor James was confirmed as House Chaplain for this legislative week.
