17 which relates to license plates; discontinuing the  
18 Northern Cherokee Nation of the Old Louisiana  
19 Territory License Plate; relocating civil emergency  
20 management license plate; creating National Weather  
21 Center license plate; creating the In God We Trust  
22 special license plate; amending Section 14, Chapter  
23 504, O.S.L. 2004, as last amended by Section 25,  
24 Chapter 44, 2nd Extraordinary Session, O.S.L. 2006  
(47 O.S. Supp. 2007, Section 1135.5), which relates  
to special license plates; creating the Juvenile  
Diabetes Research Foundation License Plate; creating  
the Tulsa Police Department Memorial License Plate;  
creating the Department of Corrections License  
Plate; providing for deposits into specified funds;  
creating Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation  
License Plate Revolving Fund; providing source of  
funding; providing for expenditures; stating  
purpose; creating Tulsa Police Department Memorial  
License Plate Revolving Fund; providing source of  
funding; providing for expenditures; stating  
purpose; creating Department of Corrections License  
Plate Revolving Fund; providing source of funding;  
providing for expenditures; stating purpose;  
amending 47 O.S. 2001, Section 1140, as last amended  
by Section 77, Chapter 1, O.S.L. 2005 (47 O.S. Supp.  
2007, Section 1140), which relates to motor license  
agencies; authorizing Tax Commission to approve  
certain locations of motor license agencies;  
providing for codification; and providing an  
effective date.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

2 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2001, Section 11-1007, as  
3 last amended by Section 14, Chapter 62, O.S.L. 2007 (47 O.S. Supp.  
4 2007, Section 11-1007), is amended to read as follows:

5 Section 11-1007. A. It shall be unlawful for any person to  
6 place or park a motor vehicle in any parking space that is  
7 designated and posted as a reserved area for the parking of a motor  
8 vehicle operated by or transporting a physically disabled person  
9 unless such person has applied for and been issued a detachable  
10 insignia indicating physical disability under the provisions of  
11 Section 15-112 of this title, and such insignia is displayed as  
12 provided in Section 15-112 of this title or in rules adopted  
13 pursuant thereto, ~~or~~ has applied for and been issued a physically  
14 disabled special license plate pursuant to the provisions of Section  
15 1135.1 of this title, and such license plate is displayed pursuant  
16 to the provisions of the Oklahoma Vehicle License and Registration  
17 Act or has applied for and been issued a disabled veteran license  
18 plate with the international accessibility symbol pursuant to the  
19 provisions of Section 1135.2 of this title, and such plate is  
20 displayed pursuant to the provisions of the Oklahoma Vehicle License  
21 and Registration Act. It shall also be unlawful for any person to  
22 place or park a motor vehicle, whether with or without a physically  
23 disabled placard or plate, in any disabled parking space access  
24

1 aisle, wheelchair ramp, wheelchair loading/unloading area or any  
2 portion thereof.

3 B. Violation of these provisions shall be a misdemeanor and  
4 upon conviction such person shall be fined not less than One Hundred  
5 Fifty Dollars (\$150.00) and not more than Two Hundred Fifty Dollars  
6 (\$250.00). Provided, any person cited for a first offense of a  
7 violation of this section who has displayed a placard which has  
8 expired pursuant to paragraph 4 or 5 of subsection D of Section 15-  
9 112 of this title shall be entitled to dismissal of such charge and  
10 shall not be required to pay the fine or court costs if the person  
11 presents to the court within thirty (30) days of the issuance of the  
12 citation a notice from the Department of Public Safety that the  
13 person has obtained a valid placard pursuant to the provisions of  
14 subsection D of Section 15-112 of this title. In addition, vehicles  
15 unlawfully parked in violation of these provisions shall be subject  
16 to immediate tow by a licensed tow truck operator at the request of  
17 the landowner or a duly appointed agent of the landowner, at the  
18 request of any person unable to lawfully gain access to or move  
19 their vehicle, at the request of any person unable to lawfully gain  
20 access to the area blocked by the unlawfully parked vehicle, or at  
21 the request of appropriate law-enforcement personnel. The owner of  
22 any vehicle unlawfully parked in violation of these provisions shall  
23 pay any and all reasonable and necessary costs associated with  
24 towing and storage of the vehicle.

1 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2001, Section 15-112, as  
2 last amended by Section 17, Chapter 326, O.S.L. 2007 (47 O.S. Supp.  
3 2007, Section 15-112), is amended to read as follows:

4 Section 15-112. A. As used in this section:

5 1. "Physician" means any person holding a valid license to  
6 practice medicine and surgery, osteopathic medicine, chiropractic,  
7 podiatric medicine, or optometry, pursuant to the state licensing  
8 provisions of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

9 2. "Physician assistant" means any person holding a valid  
10 license as a physician assistant, pursuant to the state licensing  
11 provisions of the Physician Assistant Act;

12 3. "Advanced registered nurse practitioner" means any person  
13 who holds a current license as a registered nurse and a current  
14 certificate of recognition for practice as an Advanced Registered  
15 Nurse Practitioner as set forth in the Oklahoma Nursing Practice Act  
16 pursuant to the state licensing provisions contained in paragraph 5  
17 of Section 567.3a of Title 59 of the Oklahoma Statutes; and

18 4. "Physical disability" means an illness, disease, injury or  
19 condition by reason of which a person:

20 a. cannot walk two hundred (200) feet without stopping to  
21 rest,

22 b. cannot walk without the use of or assistance from a  
23 brace, cane, crutch, another person, prosthetic  
24 device, wheelchair or other assistance device,

- 1 c. is restricted to such an extent that the person's  
2 forced (respiratory) expiratory volume for one (1)  
3 second, when measured by spirometry, is less than one  
4 (1) liter, or the arterial oxygen tension is less than  
5 sixty (60) mm/hg on room air at rest,
- 6 d. must use portable oxygen,
- 7 e. has functional limitations which are classified in  
8 severity as Class III or Class IV according to  
9 standards set by the American Heart Association,
- 10 f. is severely limited in the person's ability to walk  
11 due to an arthritic, neurological or orthopedic  
12 condition, or from complications due to pregnancy,
- 13 g. is certified legally blind, or
- 14 h. is missing one or more limbs.

15 B. 1. The Department of Public Safety shall issue a detachable  
16 placard indicating physical disability to any person who submits an  
17 application on a form furnished by the Department of Public Safety  
18 and certified by a physician, physician assistant, or advanced  
19 registered nurse practitioner attesting that the applicant has a  
20 physical disability. The attestation of the physician, physician  
21 assistant, or advanced registered nurse practitioner shall denote  
22 "temporary" as the type of placard requested and shall indicate an  
23 expiration date which the physician, physician assistant, or  
24 advanced registered nurse practitioner estimates to be the date of

1 termination of such physical disability; however, if the physician,  
2 physician assistant, or advanced registered nurse practitioner  
3 certifies that the physical disability is permanent, the physician,  
4 physician assistant, or advanced registered nurse practitioner shall  
5 denote "five-year" as the type of placard requested.

6 2. The person to whom such placard is issued shall be entitled  
7 to the special parking privileges provided for in Section 15-111 of  
8 this title; provided, however, the placard is properly displayed on  
9 the parked vehicle.

10 C. Any placard issued by the Department of Public Safety shall  
11 remain valid until:

12 1. The placard expires;

13 2. The person to whom the placard was issued requests a  
14 replacement placard; or

15 3. The placard is no longer needed by the person to whom the  
16 placard was issued for the disability for which the placard was  
17 originally issued, whereupon such placard shall be returned to the  
18 Department of Public Safety.

19 D. 1. A five-year placard shall expire five (5) years from the  
20 last day of the month in which the placard was issued. Upon the  
21 expiration of a five-year placard, the person to whom such placard  
22 was issued may obtain a subsequent placard by reapplying to the  
23 Department of Public Safety, in the same manner as provided in  
24 subsection B of this section.

1           2. A temporary placard shall indicate the expiration date which  
2 the physician, physician assistant, or advanced registered nurse  
3 practitioner certifying the physical disability estimates to be the  
4 date of termination of such physical disability, which shall not be  
5 later than six (6) months from the date of issuance and upon which  
6 date such placard shall expire and shall be returned to the  
7 Department of Public Safety; provided, however, nothing in this  
8 paragraph shall be construed to prevent the holder from applying for  
9 another placard, as provided for in this section.

10           3. In the event that a placard is lost or destroyed, the person  
11 to whom such placard was issued may apply in writing to the  
12 Department of Public Safety for a replacement placard, which the  
13 Department of Public Safety shall issue with the same expiration  
14 date as the original placard.

15           4. On and after January 1, 1998, all placards issued prior to  
16 October 31, 1990, shall expire on the last day of the month in which  
17 the placard was issued, and the person to whom such placard was  
18 issued may follow the procedure provided for in subsection B of this  
19 section to obtain a second or subsequent placard.

20           5. On and after January 1, 2000, all placards issued between  
21 November 1, 1990, and June 30, 1995, shall expire on the last day of  
22 the birth month of the person to whom the placard was issued, and  
23 the person to whom such placard was issued may follow the procedure  
24

1 provided for in subsection B of this section to obtain a second or  
2 subsequent placard.

3 E. A physician, physician assistant, or advanced registered  
4 nurse practitioner may sign an application certifying that a person  
5 has a physical disability, as provided in subsection B of this  
6 section, only if care and treatment of the illness, disease, injury  
7 or condition causing the physical disability of such person falls  
8 within the authorized scope of practice of the physician or  
9 physician assistant, or advanced registered nurse practitioner.

10 F. The Department of Public Safety shall recognize handicap and  
11 disability stickers issued by the Department of Veterans Affairs and  
12 federal military bases and disabled veterans license plate with the  
13 international accessibility symbol, issued pursuant to the  
14 provisions of Section 1135.2 of this title in the same manner as the  
15 placard issued by the Department of Public Safety as provided for in  
16 this section. For purposes of this section and other sections of  
17 law relating to the physical disability placard, the term "physical  
18 disability placard" shall include those handicap and disability  
19 stickers issued by the Department of Veterans Affairs and federal  
20 military bases and disabled veterans license plate with the  
21 international accessibility symbol, issued pursuant to the  
22 provisions of Section 1135.2 of this title.

23 G. The Department of Public Safety shall have the power to  
24 formulate, adopt and promulgate rules as may be necessary to

1 implement and administer the provisions of this section, including,  
2 but not limited to, prescribing the manner in which the placard is  
3 to be displayed on a motor vehicle.

4 H. The Commissioner of Public Safety is hereby authorized to  
5 enter into reciprocity agreements with other states for the purpose  
6 of recognizing parking placards or license plates indicating  
7 physical disability issued by those states.

8 I. The Department of Public Safety shall charge and the  
9 applicant shall pay to the Department of Public Safety a fee of One  
10 Dollar (\$1.00) for each placard issued. The fee shall be deposited  
11 in the Department of Public Safety Revolving Fund.

12 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2001, Section 1113, as  
13 last amended by Section 4, Chapter 284, O.S.L. 2005 (47 O.S. Supp.  
14 2007, Section 1113), is amended to read as follows:

15 Section 1113. A. 1. Except for all-terrain vehicles and  
16 motorcycles used exclusively off roads and highways, upon the filing  
17 of a registration application and the payment of the fees provided  
18 for in the Oklahoma Vehicle License and Registration Act, the  
19 Oklahoma Tax Commission or Corporation Commission, as applicable,  
20 shall assign to the vehicle described in the application a  
21 distinctive number, and issue to the owner of the vehicle a  
22 certificate of registration, one license plate and a yearly decal.  
23 The Oklahoma Tax Commission shall assign an all-terrain vehicle or  
24 motorcycle used exclusively off roads and highways a distinctive

1 number and issue to the owner a certificate of registration and a  
2 decal but not a license plate. For each subsequent registration  
3 year, the Tax Commission shall issue a yearly decal to be affixed to  
4 the license plate, except for an all-terrain vehicle or motorcycle  
5 used exclusively off roads and highways. The initial decal for an  
6 all-terrain vehicle or motorcycle shall be attached to the front of  
7 the all-terrain vehicle and shall be in clear view. The decal shall  
8 be on the front or on the front fork of the motorcycle used  
9 exclusively off roads and highways and the decal shall be in clear  
10 view. The yearly decal shall have an identification number and the  
11 last two numbers of the registration year for which it shall expire.  
12 Except as provided by Section 1113A of this title, the license plate  
13 shall be affixed to the exterior of the vehicle until a replacement  
14 license plate is applied for. If the owner applies for a  
15 replacement license plate, the Tax Commission shall charge the fee  
16 provided for in Section 1114 of this title. The yearly decal will  
17 validate the license plate for each registration period other than  
18 the year the license plate is issued. The license plate and decal  
19 shall be of such size, color, design and numbering as the Tax  
20 Commission may direct. However, yearly decals issued to the owner  
21 of a vehicle who has filed an affidavit with the appropriate motor  
22 license agent in accordance with Section 7-607 of this title shall  
23 be a separate and distinct color from all other decals issued under  
24 this section.

1        2. The license plate shall be securely attached to the rear of  
2 the vehicle, except truck-tractor plates which shall be attached to  
3 the front of the vehicle. The Tax Commission may, with the  
4 concurrence of the Department of Public Safety, by Joint Rule,  
5 change and direct the manner, place and location of display of any  
6 vehicle license plate when such action is deemed in the public  
7 interest. The license plate, decal and all letters and numbers  
8 shall be clearly visible at all times. The operation of a vehicle  
9 in this state, regardless of where such vehicle is registered, upon  
10 which the license plate is covered, overlaid or otherwise screened  
11 with any material, whether such material be clear, translucent,  
12 tinted or opaque, shall be a violation of this paragraph.

13        3. Upon payment of the annual registration fee provided in  
14 Section 1133 of this title, the Tax Commission or Corporation  
15 Commission, as applicable, or a motor license agent may issue a  
16 permanent nonexpiring license plate to an owner of one hundred or  
17 more commercial motor vehicles and for vehicles registered under the  
18 provisions of Section 1120 of this title. Upon payment of the  
19 annual registration fee, the Tax Commission or Corporation  
20 Commission shall issue a certificate of registration that shall be  
21 carried at all times in the vehicle for which it is issued.  
22 Provided, if the registrant submits its application through  
23 electronic means, such qualified owners of one hundred or more  
24 commercial motor vehicles, properly registered pursuant to the

1 provisions of Section 1133 of this title, may elect to receive a  
2 permanent certificate of registration that shall be carried at all  
3 times in the vehicle for which it is issued.

4 4. Every vehicle owned by an agency of this state and vehicles  
5 owned by a congressionally chartered and federally supported  
6 civilian auxiliary of a branch of the United States Armed Forces  
7 shall be exempt from the payment of registration fees required by  
8 this title. Provided, such vehicle shall be registered and shall  
9 otherwise comply with the provisions of the Oklahoma Vehicle License  
10 and Registration Act.

11 B. The license plates required under the provisions of this  
12 title shall conform to the requirements and specifications listed  
13 hereinafter:

14 1. Each license plate shall have a space for the placement of  
15 the yearly decals for each succeeding year of registration after the  
16 initial issue;

17 2. The provisions of the Oklahoma Vehicle License and  
18 Registration Act regarding the issuance of yearly decals shall not  
19 apply to the issuance of apportioned license plates, including  
20 license plates for state vehicles, and exempt plates for  
21 governmental entities and fire departments organized pursuant to  
22 Section 592 of Title 18 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

23 3. Within the limits herein prescribed the Tax Commission shall  
24 redesign the official vehicle license plates which currently bear

1 the legend "Oklahoma OK" or "Oklahoma is OK!" and substitute  
2 therefor the legend "Oklahoma Native America" as further described  
3 in this paragraph. Except for personalized license plates and  
4 license plates issued for motorcycles and mopeds, the emblem on the  
5 state flag of Oklahoma as provided for in Section 91 of Title 25 of  
6 the Oklahoma Statutes shall be a part of all license plates issued  
7 after December 31, 1988. The Tax Commission may continue to issue  
8 license plates with the legend "Oklahoma is OK!" or "Oklahoma OK"  
9 until any inventory of such license plates is depleted but the Tax  
10 Commission shall not produce or cause to be produced any additional  
11 license plates with these legends. Except for personalized license  
12 plates, license plates issued for commercial vehicles, and license  
13 plates issued for motorcycles and mopeds, the "Oklahoma Native  
14 America" emblem shall be a part of all license plates issued after  
15 December 31, 1993. The specifications for lettering style and  
16 appearance for the legend "Oklahoma Native America" shall be  
17 provided to the Tax Commission by the Oklahoma Tourism and  
18 Recreation Department. The license plates shall be issued with the  
19 letters and numerals in the colors of green and white. All license  
20 plates and decals shall be made with reflectorized material as a  
21 background to the letters, numbers and characters displayed thereon.  
22 The reflectorized material shall be of such a nature as to provide  
23 effective and dependable brightness during the service period for  
24 which the license plate or decal is issued;

1           4. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the Tax  
2 Commission shall design appropriate official license plates for all  
3 state vehicles and vehicles owned by a congressionally chartered and  
4 federally supported civilian auxiliary of a branch of the United  
5 States Armed Forces. Such license plates shall be permanent in  
6 nature and designed in such manner as to remain with the vehicle for  
7 the duration of the vehicle's life span or until the title is  
8 transferred to a nongovernmental owner;

9           5. Within the limits prescribed in this section, the Tax  
10 Commission shall design appropriate official license plates for  
11 vehicles of the Oklahoma Highway Patrol. The license plates shall  
12 have the legend "Oklahoma OK" and shall contain the letters "OHP"  
13 followed by the state seal and the badge number of the Highway  
14 Patrol officer to whom the vehicle is assigned. The words "Oklahoma  
15 Highway Patrol" shall also be included on such license plates; and

16           6. Within the limits prescribed in this section, the Tax  
17 Commission shall design appropriate official license plates for  
18 vehicles of the Oklahoma Military Department. Such license plates  
19 shall have the legend "Oklahoma OK" and shall contain the letters  
20 "OMD" followed by the state seal and three numbers or letters as  
21 designated by the Adjutant General. The words "Oklahoma Military  
22 Department" shall also be included on such license plates.

23           C. Where the applicant has satisfactorily shown that the  
24 applicant owns the vehicle sought to be registered but is unable to

1 produce documentary evidence of the ownership, a license plate may  
2 be issued upon approval by the Tax Commission or Corporation  
3 Commission, as applicable. In such instances the reason for not  
4 issuing a certificate of title shall be indicated on the receipt  
5 given to the applicant. It shall still be the duty of the applicant  
6 to immediately take all necessary steps to obtain the Oklahoma  
7 certificate of title and it shall be unlawful for the applicant to  
8 sell the vehicle until the certificate has been obtained in the  
9 applicant's name.

10 D. The certificate of registration provided for in this section  
11 shall be in convenient form, and the certificate of registration, or  
12 a certified copy or photostatic copy thereof, duly authenticated by  
13 the Tax Commission or Corporation Commission, as applicable, shall  
14 be carried at all times in or upon commercial vehicles so  
15 registered, in such manner as to permit a ready examination thereof  
16 upon demand by any peace officer of the state or duly authorized  
17 employee of the Department of Public Safety. Any such officer or  
18 agent may seize and hold such commercial vehicle when the operator  
19 of the same does not have the registration certificate in the  
20 operator's possession or when any such officer or agent determines  
21 that the registration certificate has been obtained by  
22 misrepresentation of any essential or material fact or when any  
23 number or identifying information appearing on such certificate has  
24 been changed, altered, obliterated or concealed in any way, until

1 the proper registration or identification of such vehicle has been  
2 made or produced by the owner thereof.

3 E. The purchaser of a new or used manufactured home shall,  
4 within thirty (30) days of the date of purchase, register the home  
5 with the Tax Commission or a motor license agent pursuant to the  
6 provisions of Section 1117 of this title. For a new manufactured  
7 home, it shall be the responsibility of the dealer selling the home  
8 to place a temporary license plate on the home in the same manner as  
9 provided in Section 1128 of this title for other new motor vehicles.  
10 For the first year that any manufactured home is registered in this  
11 state, the Tax Commission shall issue a metal license plate which  
12 shall be affixed to the manufactured home. The temporary dealer  
13 license plate or the metal license plate shall be displayed on the  
14 manufactured home at all times when upon a public roadway; provided,  
15 a repossession affidavit issued pursuant to Sections 1110 and 1126  
16 of this title shall be permissible in lieu of a current license  
17 plate and decal for the purposes of removing a repossessed  
18 manufactured home to a secure location. Manufactured homes  
19 previously registered and subject to ad valorem taxation as provided  
20 by law shall have a decal affixed at the time ad valorem taxes are  
21 paid for such manufactured home; provided, for a manufactured home  
22 permanently affixed to real estate, no decal or license plate shall  
23 be required to be affixed and the owner thereof shall be given a  
24 receipt upon payment of ad valorem taxes due on the home. The Tax

1 Commission shall make sufficient plates and decals available to the  
2 various motor license agents of the state in order for an owner of a  
3 manufactured home to acquire the plate or decal. A One Dollar  
4 (\$1.00) fee shall be charged for issuance of any plate or decal.  
5 The fee shall be apportioned each month to the General Revenue Fund  
6 of the State Treasury.

7 F. The manufactured home license plate shall be designed so  
8 that it is easily visible for purposes of verification by a county  
9 assessor that the manufactured home is properly assessed for ad  
10 valorem taxation. The plate shall be designed for a yearly decal.  
11 In the first year of registration, a decal shall be issued for  
12 placement on the license plate indicating payment of applicable  
13 registration fees and excise taxes. In the second and all  
14 subsequent years for which the manufactured home is subject to ad  
15 valorem taxation, an annual decal shall be affixed to the license  
16 plate as evidence of payment of ad valorem taxes. The Tax  
17 Commission shall issue decals to the various county treasurers of  
18 the state in order for a manufactured home owner to obtain such  
19 decal each year. Upon presentation of a valid ad valorem tax  
20 receipt, the manufactured home owner shall be issued the annual  
21 decal.

22 G. Upon the registration of a manufactured home in this state  
23 for the first time or upon discovery of a manufactured home  
24 previously registered within this state for which the information

1 required by this subsection is not known, the Tax Commission shall  
2 obtain:

- 3 1. The name of the owner of the manufactured home;
- 4 2. The serial number or identification number of the  
5 manufactured home;
- 6 3. A legal description or address of the location for the home;
- 7 4. The actual retail selling price of the manufactured home  
8 excluding Oklahoma taxes;
- 9 5. The certificate of title number for the home; and
- 10 6. Any other information which the Tax Commission deems to be  
11 necessary.

12 The application for registration shall also include the school  
13 district in which the manufactured home is located or is to be  
14 located. The information shall be entered into a computer data  
15 system which shall be used by the Tax Commission to provide  
16 information to county assessors upon request by the assessor. The  
17 assessor may request any information from the system in order to  
18 properly assess a manufactured home for ad valorem taxation.

19 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY Section 11, Chapter 504, O.S.L.  
20 2004, as last amended by Section 31, Chapter 1, O.S.L. 2007 (47 O.S.  
21 Supp. 2007, Section 1135.2), is amended to read as follows:

22 Section 1135.2 A. The Oklahoma Tax Commission is hereby  
23 authorized to design and issue appropriate official special license  
24

1 plates to persons in recognition of their service or awards as  
2 provided by this section.

3 Special license plates shall not be transferred to any other  
4 person but shall be removed from the vehicle upon transfer of  
5 ownership and retained. The special license plate may then be used  
6 on another vehicle but only after such other vehicle has been  
7 registered for the current year.

8 Special license plates shall be renewed each year by the Tax  
9 Commission or a motor license agent. The Tax Commission shall  
10 annually notify by mail all persons issued special license plates.  
11 The notice shall contain all necessary information and shall contain  
12 instructions for the renewal procedure upon presentation to a motor  
13 license agent or the Tax Commission. The license plates shall be  
14 issued on a staggered system except for legislative plates and  
15 amateur radio operator license plates.

16 The Tax Commission is hereby directed to develop and implement a  
17 system whereby motor license agents are permitted to accept  
18 applications for special license plates authorized under this  
19 section. The motor license agent shall confirm the applicant's  
20 eligibility, if applicable, collect and deposit any amount  
21 specifically authorized by law, accept and process the necessary  
22 information directly into such system and generate a receipt  
23 accordingly. For performance of these duties, motor license agents  
24 shall retain the fee provided in Section 1141.1 of this title for

1 registration of a motor vehicle. The motor license agent fees for  
2 acceptance of applications and renewals shall be paid out of the  
3 Oklahoma Tax Commission Reimbursement Fund.

4 B. The special license plates provided by this section are as  
5 follows:

6 1. Prisoner of War License Plates - such plates shall be  
7 designed for honorably discharged or present members of the United  
8 States Armed Forces and civilians who were former prisoners of war  
9 held by a foreign country and who can provide proper certification  
10 of that status. Such persons may apply for a prisoner of war  
11 license plate for no more than two vehicles with each vehicle having  
12 a rated carrying capacity of one (1) ton or less. The surviving  
13 spouse of any deceased former prisoner of war, if the spouse has not  
14 since remarried, or if remarried, the remarriage is terminated by  
15 death, divorce, or annulment, may apply for a prisoner of war  
16 license plate for one vehicle with a rated carrying capacity of one  
17 (1) ton or less. The fee provided by this section for the special  
18 license plate authorized by this paragraph shall be in addition to  
19 all other registration fees provided by law, except the registration  
20 fees levied by Section 1132 of this title;

21 2. National Guard License Plates - such plates shall be  
22 designed for active or retired members of the Oklahoma National  
23 Guard. Retirees who are eligible for such plates shall provide  
24

1 proof of eligibility upon initial application, but shall not be  
2 required to provide proof of eligibility annually;

3 3. Air National Guard License Plates - such plates shall be  
4 designed for active or retired members of the Oklahoma Air National  
5 Guard. Retirees who are eligible for such plates shall provide  
6 proof of eligibility upon initial application, but shall not be  
7 required to provide proof of eligibility annually;

8 4. United States Armed Forces - such plates shall be designed  
9 for active, retired, former or reserve members of the United States  
10 Armed Forces, and shall identify which branch of service, and carry  
11 the emblem and name of either the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines or  
12 Coast Guard, according to the branch of service to which the member  
13 belongs or did belong. Former members who have been dishonorably  
14 discharged shall not be eligible for such plates. Persons applying  
15 for such license plate must show proof of present or past military  
16 service by presenting a valid Uniformed Services Identity Card or  
17 the United States Department of Defense Form (DD)214. Retired or  
18 former members who are eligible for such plates shall provide proof  
19 of eligibility upon initial application, but shall not be required  
20 to provide proof of eligibility annually;

21 5. Congressional Medal of Honor Recipient License Plates - such  
22 plates shall be designed for any resident of this state who has been  
23 awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor. Such persons may apply  
24 for a Congressional Medal of Honor recipient license plate for each

1 vehicle with a rated carrying capacity of one (1) ton or less.

2 There shall be no registration fee for the issuance of this plate;

3       6. Missing In Action License Plates - such plates shall be  
4 designed to honor members of the United States Armed Forces who are  
5 missing in action. The spouse of such missing person, if the spouse  
6 has not since remarried, or if remarried, the remarriage is  
7 terminated by death, divorce, or annulment, and each parent of the  
8 missing person may apply for a missing in action license plate upon  
9 presenting proper certification that the person is missing in action  
10 and that the person making the application is the qualifying spouse  
11 or the parent of the missing person. The qualifying spouse and each  
12 parent of the missing person may each apply for the missing in  
13 action license plate for each vehicle with a rated carrying capacity  
14 of one (1) ton or less;

15       7. Purple Heart Recipient License Plates - such plates shall be  
16 designed for any resident of this state presenting proper  
17 certification from the United States Department of Veterans Affairs  
18 or the Armed Forces of the United States certifying that such  
19 resident has been awarded the Purple Heart military decoration.  
20 Such persons may apply for a Purple Heart recipient license plate  
21 for vehicles having a rated carrying capacity of one (1) ton or  
22 less. The surviving spouse of any deceased veteran who has been  
23 awarded the Purple Heart military decoration, if such spouse has not  
24 since remarried, or if remarried, the remarriage has been terminated

1 by death, divorce or annulment, may apply for such plate for one  
2 vehicle with a rated carrying capacity of one (1) ton or less;

3 8. Pearl Harbor Survivor License Plates - such plates shall be  
4 designed for any resident of this state who can be verified by the  
5 United States Department of Veterans Affairs or the Armed Forces of  
6 the United States as being:

7 a. a member of the United States Armed Forces on December  
8 7, 1941,

9 b. stationed on December 7, 1941, during the hours of  
10 7:55 a.m. to 9:45 a.m. Hawaii time at Pearl Harbor,  
11 the island of Oahu, or offshore at a distance not to  
12 exceed three (3) miles, and

13 c. a recipient of an honorable discharge from the United  
14 States Armed Forces.

15 Such person may apply for a Pearl Harbor Survivor license plate  
16 for each vehicle with a rated carrying capacity of one (1) ton or  
17 less;

18 9. Iwo Jima License Plates - such plates shall be designed for  
19 any resident of this state who can be verified by the United States  
20 Department of Veterans Affairs or the Armed Forces of the United  
21 States as being:

22 a. a member of the United States Armed Forces in February  
23 of 1945,

24

1           b.    stationed in February of 1945 on or in the immediate  
2               vicinity of the island of Iwo Jima, and

3           c.    a recipient of an honorable discharge from the United  
4               States Armed Forces.

5           Such person may apply for an Iwo Jima license plate for each  
6           vehicle with a rated carrying capacity of one (1) ton or less.

7           Such license plate shall have the legend "Oklahoma OK" and shall  
8           contain three letters and three numbers. Between the letters and  
9           numbers shall be a logo of the flag-raising at Iwo Jima. Below the  
10          letters, logo and numbers, the plate shall contain the words "FEB."  
11          at the left, "Iwo Jima" in the center and "1945" at the right. Such  
12          plates shall not be subject to the design requirements of any other  
13          license plates prescribed by law other than the space for the  
14          placement of the yearly decals for each succeeding year of  
15          registration after the initial issue;

16          10. D-Day Survivor License Plates - such plates shall be  
17          designed for any resident of this state who can be verified by the  
18          United States Department of Veterans Affairs or the Armed Forces of  
19          the United States as being:

20           a.    a member of the United States Armed Forces on June 6,  
21                1944,

22           b.    a participant in the Allied invasion of the coast of  
23                Normandy on June 6, 1944; provided, if such  
24                participation cannot be verified by the United States

1 Department of Veterans Affairs or the Armed Forces of  
2 the United States, the Tax Commission may, in its  
3 discretion, accept evidence of such participation from  
4 the person applying for the license plate, and

5 c. a recipient of an honorable discharge from the United  
6 States Armed Forces.

7 Such person may apply for a D-Day Survivor license plate for  
8 each vehicle with a rated carrying capacity of one (1) ton or less;

9 11. Killed in Action License Plates - such plates shall be  
10 designed to honor members of the United States Armed Forces who were  
11 killed in action. The spouse of the deceased person, if the spouse  
12 has not remarried, or if remarried, the remarriage is terminated by  
13 death, divorce, or annulment, may apply for a killed in action  
14 license plate upon presenting proper certification that the person  
15 was killed in action and that the person making the application is  
16 the qualifying spouse of the deceased person. The qualifying spouse  
17 may apply for a killed in action license plate for no more than two  
18 vehicles with each vehicle with a rated carrying capacity of one (1)  
19 ton or less. The fee provided by this section for the special  
20 license plate authorized by this paragraph shall be in addition to  
21 all other registration fees provided by law, except the registration  
22 fees levied by Section 1132 of this title;

23 12. Gold Star ~~Parents~~ License Plates - such plates shall be  
24 designed to honor members of the United States Armed Forces who were

1 killed during a war. The parents or surviving spouse of the  
2 deceased person may apply for a gold star ~~parents~~ license plate upon  
3 presenting proper certification that the person was killed during a  
4 war and that the person making the application is the parent or  
5 surviving spouse of the deceased person. The parent or surviving  
6 spouse may apply for a gold star ~~parent~~ license plate for no more  
7 than two vehicles with each vehicle having a rated carrying capacity  
8 of one (1) ton or less. The fee provided by this section for the  
9 special license plate authorized by this paragraph shall be in  
10 addition to all other registration fees provided by law, except the  
11 registration fees levied by Section 1132 of this title;

12 13. Military Decoration License Plates - such plates shall be  
13 designed for any resident of this state who has been awarded the  
14 Distinguished Service Medal, the Distinguished Service Cross, the  
15 Distinguished Flying Cross, the Bronze Star military decoration or  
16 the Silver Star military decoration. Such persons may apply for a  
17 military decoration license plate for each vehicle with a rated  
18 carrying capacity of one (1) ton or less;

19 14. Vietnam Veteran License Plates - such plates shall be  
20 designed for honorably discharged or present members of the United  
21 States Armed Forces who served in the Vietnam Conflict. Such  
22 persons may apply for a Vietnam veteran license plate for each  
23 vehicle with a rated carrying capacity of one (1) ton or less;

24

1           15. Police Officer License Plates - such plates shall be  
2 designed for any currently employed or retired municipal or  
3 university police officer. Police officers may apply for police  
4 officer license plates for vehicles with a rated capacity of one (1)  
5 ton or less or for a motorcycle upon proof of employment by or  
6 retirement from a municipal or university police department by  
7 either an identification card or letter from the chief of the police  
8 department or the Oklahoma Police Pension and Retirement Board.  
9 Retirees who are eligible for such plates shall provide proof of  
10 eligibility upon initial application, but shall not be required to  
11 provide proof of eligibility annually. The license plates shall be  
12 designed in consultation with municipal police departments of this  
13 state; provided, the license plate for motorcycles may be of similar  
14 design to the license plate for motor vehicles or may be a new  
15 design in order to meet space requirements for a motorcycle license  
16 plate;

17           16. World War II Veteran License Plates - such plates shall be  
18 designed to honor honorably discharged former members of the United  
19 States Armed Forces who are residents of this state and who can be  
20 verified by the Oklahoma Military Department, the Department of  
21 Veterans Affairs or the Armed Forces of the United States as having  
22 served on federal active duty anytime during the period from  
23 September 16, 1940, to December 7, 1945. The former members may  
24

1 apply for a World War II Veteran license plate for vehicles with a  
2 rated carrying capacity of one (1) ton or less.

3 The license plate shall have the legend "Oklahoma" and shall  
4 contain, in the center of the plate, either the Thunderbird Insignia  
5 of the 45th Infantry Division in the prescribed red and gold  
6 coloring or the emblem of the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines or  
7 Coast Guard according to the branch of service to which the member  
8 belonged. For the purpose of license plate identification, the  
9 plate shall contain four digits, two digits at the left and two  
10 digits at the right of the insignia or emblem. Centered on the  
11 bottom of the license plate shall be the words "WORLD WAR II";

12 17. Korean War Veteran License Plates - such plates shall be  
13 designed to honor honorably discharged former members of the United  
14 States Armed Forces who are residents of this state and who can be  
15 verified by the Oklahoma Military Department, the Department of  
16 Veterans Affairs or the Armed Forces of the United States as having  
17 served on federal active duty anytime during the period from June  
18 27, 1950, to January 31, 1955, both dates inclusive. The former  
19 members may apply for a Korean War Veteran license plate for  
20 vehicles with a rated carrying capacity of one (1) ton or less.

21 The license plate shall have the legend "OKLAHOMA" and shall  
22 contain, in the center of the plate, either the Thunderbird Insignia  
23 of the 45th Infantry Division in the prescribed red and gold  
24 coloring or the emblem of the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines or

1 Coast Guard according to the branch of service to which the member  
2 belonged. For the purpose of license plate identification, the  
3 plate shall contain four digits, two digits at the left and two  
4 digits at the right of the insignia or emblem. Centered on the  
5 bottom of the license plate shall be the word "KOREA";

6 18. Municipal Official License Plates - such plates shall be  
7 designed for persons elected to a municipal office in this state and  
8 shall designate the name of the municipality and the district or  
9 ward in which the municipal official serves. The plates shall only  
10 be produced upon application;

11 19. Red Cross Volunteer License Plates - such plates shall be  
12 designed to honor American Red Cross volunteers and staff who are  
13 residents of this state. Such persons must present an  
14 identification card issued by the American Red Cross and bearing a  
15 photograph of the person. The license plate shall be designed with  
16 the assistance of the American Red Cross and shall have the legend  
17 "Oklahoma OK!" in the color Pantone 186C Red. Below the legend the  
18 symbol of the American Red Cross and no more than three letters and  
19 three numbers shall be in the color Pantone 186C Red. Below the  
20 symbol and letters and numbers shall be the words "American Red  
21 Cross" in black. The plates shall not be subject to the design  
22 requirements of any other license plates prescribed by law other  
23 than the space for the placement of the yearly decals for each  
24 succeeding year of registration after the initial issue;

1        20. Veterans of Foreign Wars License Plates - such plates shall  
2 be designed to honor the veterans of foreign wars and issued to any  
3 resident of this state who is a member of a Veterans of Foreign Wars  
4 organization in this state. Such persons may apply for Veterans of  
5 Foreign Wars license plates upon proof of membership in a Veterans  
6 of Foreign Wars organization. The license plate shall be designed  
7 in consultation with the Veterans of Foreign Wars organization;

8        21. Desert Storm License Plates - such plates shall be designed  
9 and issued to any honorably discharged or present member of the  
10 United States Armed Forces who served in the Persian Gulf Crisis and  
11 the Desert Storm operation. Such persons may apply for a Desert  
12 Storm license plate for each vehicle with a rated carrying capacity  
13 of one (1) ton or less;

14        22. Military Reserve Unit License Plates - such plates shall be  
15 designed and issued to any honorably discharged or present member of  
16 a reserve unit of the United States Armed Forces. Such persons may  
17 apply for a Military Reserve Unit license plate for each vehicle  
18 with a rated carrying capacity of one (1) ton or less;

19        23. Oklahoma City Bombing Victims and Survivors License Plates  
20 - such plates shall be designed and issued to any victim or survivor  
21 of the bombing attack on the Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building in  
22 downtown Oklahoma City on April 19, 1995;

23        24. Civil Air Patrol License Plates - such plates shall be  
24 designed and issued to any person who is a member of the Civil Air

1 Patrol. Such persons may apply for a Civil Air Patrol license plate  
2 for each vehicle with a rated carrying capacity of one (1) ton or  
3 less upon proof of membership in the Civil Air Patrol. The license  
4 plate shall be designed in consultation with the Civil Air Patrol;

5 25. Ninety-Nines License Plates - such plates shall be designed  
6 and issued to members of the Ninety-Nines. Persons applying for  
7 such license plate must show proof of membership in the Ninety-  
8 Nines. The license plates shall be designed in consultation with  
9 the Ninety-Nines;

10 26. Combat Infantryman Badge License Plates - such plates shall  
11 be designed to honor recipients of the Combat Infantryman Badge.  
12 The plate shall have the legend "Oklahoma OK". Below the legend  
13 shall be the Combat Infantryman Badge and three numbers. Below the  
14 badge and the numbers shall be the words "Combat Infantryman Badge".  
15 Such persons may apply for a Combat Infantryman Badge license plate  
16 for each vehicle with a rated carrying capacity of one (1) ton or  
17 less;

18 27. Somalia Combat Veterans License Plates - such plates shall  
19 be designed and issued to any honorably discharged or present member  
20 of the United States Armed Forces who saw combat in the United  
21 Nations relief effort. Such persons may apply for a Somalia Combat  
22 Veteran license plate for each vehicle with a rated carrying  
23 capacity of one (1) ton or less;

24

1 28. Police Chaplain License Plates - such plates shall be  
2 designed and issued to members of the International Conference of  
3 Police Chaplains (ICPC) who have completed the ICPC requirements for  
4 basic certification as a police chaplain. The license plates shall  
5 be designed in consultation with the ICPC;

6 29. Joint Service Commendation Medal License Plates - such  
7 plates shall be designed and issued to any resident of this state  
8 who has been awarded the Joint Service Commendation Medal by the  
9 United States Secretary of Defense;

10 30. Merchant Marine License Plates - such plates shall be  
11 designed, subject to criteria to be presented to the Tax Commission  
12 by the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs, and issued to any  
13 person who during combat was a member of the Merchant Marines as  
14 certified by the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs. Such  
15 license plate may be issued for each vehicle with a rated carrying  
16 capacity of one (1) ton or less;

17 31. Legislative License Plates - such plates shall be designed  
18 for persons elected to the Oklahoma Legislature and shall designate  
19 the house of the Legislature in which the legislator serves and the  
20 district number;

21 32. Disabled Veterans License Plates - such plates shall be  
22 designed for persons presenting proper certification from the United  
23 States Department of Veterans Affairs or the Armed Forces of the  
24 United States certifying such veteran has a service-connected

1 disability rating of fifty percent (50%) or more, regardless which  
2 agency pays the disability benefits, or that such veteran has been  
3 awarded a vehicle by the United States government or receives a  
4 grant from the United States Department of Veterans Affairs for the  
5 purchase of an automobile due to a service-connected disability  
6 rating or due to the loss of use of a limb or an eye. Such persons  
7 may apply to the Tax Commission for a disabled veterans license  
8 plate or to a motor license agent for a regular license plate for no  
9 more than two vehicles with each vehicle having a rated carrying  
10 capacity of one (1) ton or less. The surviving spouse of any  
11 deceased disabled veteran, if the spouse has not since remarried, or  
12 if remarried, the remarriage is terminated by death, divorce, or  
13 annulment, may apply for a disabled veterans license plate for one  
14 vehicle with a rated carrying capacity of one (1) ton or less. The  
15 fee provided by this section for the special license plate  
16 authorized by this paragraph shall be in addition to all other  
17 registration fees provided by law, except the registration fees  
18 levied by Section 1132 of this title. The total expense of this  
19 license plate shall not exceed Five Dollars (\$5.00).

20 If the person qualifies for a disabled veterans license plate  
21 and is also eligible for an insignia as a physically disabled person  
22 under the provisions of Section 15-112 of this title, the person  
23 shall be eligible to receive a disabled veterans license plate that  
24 also displays the international accessibility symbol, which is a

1 stylized human figure in a wheelchair. Upon the death of the  
2 disabled veteran with a disabled veterans license plate with the  
3 international accessibility symbol, the plate shall be returned to  
4 the Tax Commission;

5 33. United States Air Force Association License Plates - such  
6 plates shall be designed for members of the United States Air Force  
7 Association. Persons applying for such license plate must show  
8 proof of membership in the Association. The license plates shall be  
9 designed in consultation with the Association;

10 34. Oklahoma Military Academy Alumni License Plates - such  
11 plates shall be designed and issued to any resident of this state  
12 who is an alumnus of the Oklahoma Military Academy. Such persons  
13 may apply for an Oklahoma Military Academy Alumnus license plate for  
14 each vehicle with a rated carrying capacity of one (1) ton or less.  
15 The license plates shall be designed in consultation with the  
16 Oklahoma Military Academy and shall contain the shield of the  
17 Academy;

18 35. Amateur Radio Operator License Plates - such plates shall  
19 be designed and issued to any person, holding a valid operator's  
20 license, technician class or better, issued by the Federal  
21 Communications Commission, and who is also the owner of a motor  
22 vehicle currently registered in Oklahoma, in which has been  
23 installed amateur mobile transmitting and receiving equipment.  
24 Eligible persons shall be entitled to two special vehicle

1 identification plates as herein provided. Application for such  
2 identification plates shall be on a form prescribed by the Oklahoma  
3 Tax Commission and the plates issued to such applicant shall have  
4 stamped thereon the word "Oklahoma" and bear the official call  
5 letters of the radio station assigned by the Federal Communications  
6 Commission to the individual amateur operator thereof. All  
7 applications for such plates must be made to the Oklahoma Tax  
8 Commission on or before the first day of October of any year for  
9 such plates for the following calendar year and must be accompanied  
10 by the fee required in this section together with a certificate, or  
11 such other evidence as the Tax Commission may require, of proof that  
12 applicant has a valid technician class or better amateur operator's  
13 license and proof of his ownership of a vehicle in which radio  
14 receiving and transmitting equipment is installed. Applicants shall  
15 only be entitled to one set of special identification plates in any  
16 one (1) year, and such calendar year shall be stamped thereon. The  
17 right to such special identification plates herein provided for  
18 shall continue until the amateur radio operator's license of the  
19 person to whom such plates are issued expires or is revoked;

20 36. American Legion License Plates - such plates shall be  
21 designed for members of the American Legion. Persons applying for  
22 such license plate must show proof of membership. The license  
23 plates shall be designed in consultation with the American Legion of  
24 Oklahoma;

1           37. Deputy Sheriff License Plates - such plates shall be  
2 designed for any currently employed or retired county sheriff or  
3 deputy sheriff. County sheriffs or deputy sheriffs may apply for  
4 such plates for vehicles with a rated capacity of one (1) ton or  
5 less upon proof of employment by or retirement from a county  
6 sheriff's office by either an identification card or letter from the  
7 county sheriff or a government-sponsored retirement board from which  
8 the county sheriff or deputy sheriff may be receiving a pension.  
9 Retirees who are eligible for such plates shall provide proof of  
10 eligibility upon initial application, but shall not be required to  
11 provide proof of eligibility annually. The license plates shall be  
12 designed in consultation with the county sheriff offices of this  
13 state;

14           38. Surviving Spouse License Plates - such plates shall be  
15 designed for any resident of this state who is the surviving spouse  
16 of an honorably discharged veteran who died due to or as a  
17 consequence of a service-connected disability. Such surviving  
18 spouse may, if not since remarried, or if remarried, the remarriage  
19 is terminated by death, divorce or annulment, apply for a Surviving  
20 Spouse license plate for one vehicle with a rated carrying capacity  
21 of one (1) ton or less;

22           39. Gold Star Survivor License Plates - such plates shall be  
23 designed to honor the surviving spouses of qualified veterans. As  
24 used in this paragraph, "qualified veteran" shall mean:

1 a. any person honorably discharged from any branch of the  
2 United States Armed Forces or as a member of the  
3 Oklahoma National Guard, who died as a direct result  
4 of the performance of duties for any branch of the  
5 United States Armed Forces or Oklahoma National Guard  
6 while on active military duty, or

7 b. any person honorably discharged from any branch of the  
8 United States Armed Forces or as a member of the  
9 Oklahoma National Guard, who died as a result of  
10 injury, illness or disease caused by the performance  
11 of such duties while on active duty, whether the death

22 than three letters and three numbers in the color Pantone 301C Blue.  
23 Between the letters and numbers shall be the Firefighter Maltese  
24 Cross Logo in the color Pantone 186C Red outlined in the color

1 Pantone 301C Blue. Below the letters and the logo shall be the word  
2 "Firefighter" in the color Pantone 186C Red. The license plate for  
3 motorcycles may be of a similar design as space permits or a new  
4 design in order to meet the space requirements of a motorcycle  
5 license plate. The plates shall not be subject to the design  
6 requirements of any other license plates prescribed by law other  
7 than the space for the placement of the yearly decals for each  
8 succeeding year of registration after the initial issue.

9 As provided in this section, an amount of the fee collected  
10 shall be deposited to the Oklahoma State Firemen's Museum Building &  
11 Memorial Fund for support of the Oklahoma Firefighter Fallen and  
12 Living Memorial;

13 4. Wildlife Conservation License Plates - such plates shall be  
14 designed, subject to the criteria to be presented to the Tax  
15 Commission by the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation in  
16 consultation with the Oklahoma Arts Council, and issued to any  
17 person wishing to demonstrate support for wildlife conservation in  
18 this state through the Wildlife Diversity Fund, provided for in  
19 Section 3-310 of Title 29 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Such plates may  
20 be designed and issued to any person as for personalized license  
21 plates.

22 As provided in this section, an amount of the fee collected  
23 shall be apportioned pursuant to subsection D of Section 3-310 of  
24 Title 29 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

1           5. Child Abuse Prevention License Plates - such plates shall be  
2 designed, subject to the criteria to be presented to the Tax  
3 Commission by the Office of Child Abuse Prevention in the State  
4 Department of Health and the Oklahoma Committee to Prevent Child  
5 Abuse, and issued to any person wishing to demonstrate support for  
6 the prevention of child abuse.

7           As provided in this section, an amount of the fee collected  
8 shall be deposited in the Child Abuse Prevention Fund;

9           6. United States Olympic Committee Supporter License Plates -  
10 such plates shall be designed and issued to any person wishing to  
11 demonstrate support for the United States Olympic Committee. The  
12 plates shall be issued to any person in any combination of numbers  
13 and letters from one to a maximum of seven, as for personalized  
14 license plates. The plate shall contain the official United States  
15 Olympic Committee logo. The Tax Commission shall be authorized, if  
16 necessary, to enter into a licensing agreement with the United  
17 States Olympic Committee for any licensing fees which may be  
18 required in order to use the United States Olympic Committee logo or  
19 design. The licensing agreement shall provide for a payment of not  
20 more than Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) for each license plate  
21 issued;

22           7. Oklahoma History License Plates - such plates shall be  
23 designed and issued to any person wishing to demonstrate interest in  
24 Oklahoma history. As provided in this section, an amount of the fee

1 collected shall be deposited to the Oklahoma Historical Society  
2 Revolving Fund to be used for educational purposes;

3 8. Historic Route 66 License Plates - such plates shall be  
4 designed to honor historic Route 66, also known as the "Mother  
5 Road". As provided in this section, an amount of the fee collected  
6 shall be apportioned to the Oklahoma Historical Society Revolving  
7 Fund to be distributed to the Route 66 Museum located in Clinton,  
8 Oklahoma;

9 9. Heart of the Heartland License Plates - such plates shall be  
10 designed and issued to any person wishing to honor the victims of  
11 the terrorist bombing attack on the Alfred P. Murrah Federal  
12 Building in downtown Oklahoma City on April 19, 1995. As provided  
13 in this section, an amount of the fee collected shall be deposited  
14 in the Heart of the Heartland Scholarship Fund, as established in  
15 Section 2282 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

16 10. Emergency Medical Technician License Plates - such plates  
17 shall be designed and issued to any person who is an emergency  
18 medical technician. Such persons may apply for an emergency medical  
19 technician license plate for each vehicle with a rated carrying  
20 capacity of one (1) ton or less upon proof of an emergency medical  
21 technician's license. The license plate shall be designed in  
22 consultation with the state association of emergency medical  
23 technicians. As provided in this section, an amount of the fee  
24 collected shall be apportioned to the county of residence of the

1 person purchasing the plates to be equally apportioned by the county  
2 to the city and county volunteer fire departments in the county;

3 11. Fight Breast Cancer License Plates - such plates shall be  
4 designed to demonstrate support for the prevention and treatment of  
5 breast cancer in this state. As provided in this section, an amount  
6 of the fee collected shall be apportioned to the Breast Cancer Act  
7 Revolving Fund;

8 12. Crime Victims Awareness License Plates - such plates shall  
9 be designed and issued to any person wishing to demonstrate  
10 awareness of and support for victims of crimes. The license plates  
11 shall be designed in consultation with the Oklahoma Crime Victims  
12 Centre. As provided in this section, an amount of the fee collected  
13 shall be apportioned to the Attorney General's Revolving Fund for  
14 the Office of the Attorney General, which is hereby directed to use  
15 such funds to contract with a statewide nonprofit organization to  
16 provide services to crime victims;

17 13. Oklahoma Safe Kids Association License Plates - such plates  
18 shall be designed and issued to any person wishing to demonstrate  
19 support and awareness of the Oklahoma Safe Kids Association. The  
20 license plate shall be designed in consultation with the Oklahoma  
21 Safe Kids Association. As provided in this section, an amount of  
22 the fee collected shall be deposited in the Children's Hospital -  
23 Oklahoma Safe Kids Association Revolving Fund to be distributed to  
24 the Oklahoma Safe Kids Association program;

1        14. Four-H Club License Plates - such plates shall be designed,  
2 subject to criteria to be presented to the Tax Commission by the  
3 Four-H Foundation, and issued to any person wishing to demonstrate  
4 support of the Four-H Club. Such plates may be designed and issued  
5 to any person as for personalized license plates. As provided in  
6 this section, an amount of the fee collected shall be apportioned to  
7 the OSU Extension Service License Plate Revolving Fund created in  
8 Section 1104.4 of this title;

9        15. Agricultural Awareness License Plates - such plates shall  
10 be designed, subject to criteria to be presented to the Tax  
11 Commission, by the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and  
12 Forestry in consultation with the Oklahoma Arts Council, and issued  
13 to any person wishing to demonstrate support of the Department's Ag  
14 in the Classroom Education Program. As provided in this section, an  
15 amount of the fee collected shall be apportioned as provided in  
16 Section 1104.3 of this title;

17        16. Oklahoma Statehood Centennial License Plates - such plates  
18 shall be designed and issued to any person wishing to commemorate  
19 the centennial of Oklahoma's admission to statehood in 1907. The  
20 license plates shall be designed in consultation with the Oklahoma  
21 Capitol Complex and Centennial Commemoration Commission. As  
22 provided in this section, an amount of the fee collected shall be  
23 deposited in the Oklahoma Capitol Complex and Centennial  
24

1 Commemoration Commission Revolving Fund created in Section 98.5 of  
2 Title 73 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

3 17. Support Education License Plates - such plates shall be  
4 designed, subject to criteria to be presented to the Tax Commission  
5 by the State Department of Education in consultation with the  
6 Oklahoma Arts Council, and issued to any person wishing to  
7 demonstrate support for education in this state. All motor license  
8 agents shall display a sample of the Support Education License plate  
9 in the area of the business accessed by the public. Twenty-three  
10 Dollars (\$23.00) of the fee collected shall be apportioned as  
11 follows:

- 12 a. five percent (5%) shall be deposited to the Education  
13 Reform Revolving Fund,
- 14 b. five percent (5%) shall be deposited to the Higher

14 beautification, and issued to any person wishing to demonstrate  
15 support of such programs. As provided in this section, an amount of  
16 the fee collected shall be apportioned as provided in Section 1104.5  
17 of this title;

18       21. Oklahoma State Parks Supporter License Plates - such plates  
19 shall be designed, subject to criteria to be presented to the Tax  
20 Commission by the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department, and  
21 issued to any person wishing to demonstrate support for the Oklahoma  
22 state parks system. Twenty-three Dollars (\$23.00) of the fee

21 of the fee collected shall be deposited in the Choose Life

1        24. Future Farmers of America License Plate - such plates shall  
2 be designed and issued to persons wishing to demonstrate support for  
3 the Oklahoma FFA (formerly known as Future Farmers of America). The  
4 license plates shall be designed in consultation with the Oklahoma  
5 FFA Foundation Board of Directors. As provided in this section, an  
6 amount of the fee collected shall be apportioned as provided in  
7 Section 1104.7 of this title;

8        25. Lions Club License Plates - such plates shall be designed  
9 and issued to persons wishing to demonstrate support for the Lions  
10 Club of Oklahoma. The plates shall be issued to any person in any  
11 combination of numbers and letters from one to a maximum of seven,  
12 as for personalized license plates. The license plates shall be  
13 designed in consultation with the Oklahoma Lions Service Foundation  
14 and shall contain the official logo of the International Association  
15 of Lions Clubs. The Tax Commission shall be authorized to enter  
16 into a licensing agreement with the Oklahoma Lions Service  
17 Foundation. The licensing agreement shall provide for a payment to  
18 the Oklahoma Lions Service Foundation of not more than Ten Dollars  
19 (\$10.00) for each license plate issued;

20        26. Color Oklahoma License Plates - such plates shall be  
21 designed, subject to criteria to be presented to the Tax Commission  
22 by the Oklahoma Native Plant Society, and issued to any person  
23 wishing to demonstrate support for preserving and planting  
24 wildflowers and native plants in Oklahoma and to promote Oklahoma's

1 wildflower heritage through education. As provided in this section,  
2 an amount of the fee collected shall be apportioned as provided in  
3 Section 1104.8 of this title;

4 27. Girl Scouts of the United States of America Supporter  
5 License Plates - such plates shall be designed and issued to any  
6 person wishing to demonstrate support for the Girl Scouts of the  
7 United States of America. The plates shall be issued to any person  
8 in any combination of numbers and letters from one to a maximum of  
9 seven, as for personalized license plates. The plate shall contain  
10 the official Girl Scouts of the United States of America logo. The  
11 Tax Commission shall be authorized, if necessary, to enter into a  
12 licensing agreement with the Girl Scouts of the United States of  
13 America for any licensing fees which may be required in order to use

20 A. Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) of the fee authorized by Section  
21 1135.5 of Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes for the Juvenile  
22 Diabetes Research Foundation License Plate shall be deposited in the  
23 Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation License Plate Revolving Fund  
24 created in subsection B of this section.

1           B. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving  
2 fund for the State Department of Health to be designated the  
3 "Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation License Plate Revolving  
4 Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal  
5 year limitations, and shall consist of all monies received by the  
6 State Department of Health pursuant to the provisions of subsection  
7 A of this section. All monies accruing to the credit of the fund  
8 are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the  
9 State Department of Health at the beginning of each fiscal year for  
10 the purpose of providing grants to the Oklahoma Chapter of the  
11 Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation for purposes of promoting the  
12 mission to support research that identifies treatments for the  
13 complications and a cure for juvenile diabetes. Expenditures from  
14 the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer  
15 against claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of State  
16 Finance for approval and payment.

17           SECTION 8.           NEW LAW           A new section of law to be codified  
18 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1104.17 of Title 47, unless  
19 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

20           A. Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) of the fee authorized by Section  
21 1135.5 of Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes for the Tulsa Police  
22 Department Memorial License Plate shall be deposited in the Tulsa  
23 Police Department Memorial License Plate Revolving Fund created in  
24 subsection B of this section.

1           B. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving  
2 fund for the Department of Public Safety to be designated the "Tulsa  
3 Police Department Memorial License Plate Revolving Fund". The fund  
4 shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations,  
5 and shall consist of all monies received by the Department of Public  
6 Safety pursuant to the provisions of subsection A of this section.  
7 All monies accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby  
8 appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the Department of  
9 Public Safety to support the Tulsa Police Department Memorial.  
10 Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the  
11 State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the  
12 Director of State Finance for approval and payment.

13           SECTION 9.           NEW LAW           A new section of law to be codified  
14 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1104.18 of Title 47, unless  
15 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

16           A. Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) of the fee authorized by Section  
17 1135.5 of Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes for the Department of  
18 Corrections License Plate shall be deposited in the Department of  
19 Corrections License Plate Revolving Fund created in subsection B of  
20 this section.

21           B. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving  
22 fund for the Department of Corrections to be designated the  
23 "Department of Corrections License Plate Revolving Fund". The fund  
24 shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations,

1 and shall consist of all monies received by the Department of  
2 Corrections pursuant to the provisions of subsection A of this  
3 section. All monies accruing to the credit of the fund are hereby  
4 appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the Department of  
5 Corrections to support the Oklahoma Correctional Employees Memorial  
6 Foundation. Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon warrants  
7 issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by  
8 law with the Director of State Finance for approval and payment.

9 SECTION 10. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2001, Section 1140, as  
10 last amended by Section 77, Chapter 1, O.S.L. 2005 (47 O.S. Supp.  
11 2007, Section 1140), is amended to read as follows:

12 Section 1140. A. In municipalities having a population in  
13 excess of eight thousand five hundred (8,500) located in a county  
14 having a population in excess of one hundred thirty thousand  
15 (130,000), according to the latest Federal Decennial Census, the  
16 Oklahoma Tax Commission shall adopt rules prescribing minimum  
17 qualifications and requirements for locating motor license agencies  
18 and for persons applying for appointment as a motor license agent.  
19 Such qualifications and requirements shall include, but not be  
20 limited to, the following:

- 21 1. Necessary job skills and experience;
- 22 2. Minimum office hours;

23

- 1           3. Provision for sufficient staffing, equipment, office space  
2 and parking to provide maximum efficiency and maximum convenience to  
3 the public;
- 4           4. Obtainment of a faithful performance surety bond as provided  
5 for by law;
- 6           5. A requirement that operation of a motor license agency be  
7 the primary source of income for said agent;
- 8           6. That the applicant has not been convicted of a felony and  
9 that no felony charges are pending against the applicant;
- 10          7. That a complete financial statement be submitted by the  
11 applicant on forms provided by the Tax Commission;
- 12          8. That a report of the applicant's credit history be obtained  
13 through the appropriate credit bureau; and
- 14          9. That the location specified in the application for  
15 appointment as a motor license agent not be owned by a member of the  
16 Oklahoma Legislature or any person related to a member of the  
17 Oklahoma Legislature within the third degree by consanguinity or  
18 affinity and that the location not be within a three-mile radius of  
19 an existing motor license agency unless the applicant is assuming  
20 the location of an operating agency. The Tax Commission may, at its  
21 discretion, approve the relocation of an existing agency within a  
22 three-mile radius of another existing agency only if a naturally  
23 intervening geographic barrier within that radius causes the
- 24

1 locations to be separated by not less than three (3) miles of  
2 roadway by the most direct route.

3 After the necessary information has been forwarded to the Tax  
4 Commission, each applicant shall be interviewed by the Tax  
5 Commission or its designees and each item of information shall be  
6 reviewed.

7 The qualifications and requirements specified in this subsection  
8 shall apply only to persons making application to be appointed as  
9 motor license agents on or after June 25, 1987.

10 Any person making application to the Tax Commission for the  
11 purpose of becoming a motor license agent shall pay when submitting  
12 the application, a nonrefundable application fee of One Hundred  
13 Dollars (\$100.00). All such application fees shall be deposited in  
14 the Oklahoma Tax Commission Revolving Fund.

15 Upon application by a person to serve as a motor license agent,  
16 in such counties, the Tax Commission shall make a determination  
17 whether such person and such location meets the qualifications and  
18 requirements prescribed herein and, if such be the case, shall  
19 appoint such person to serve as a motor license agent.

20 A motor license agent, appointed pursuant to this subsection  
21 shall be permitted to operate a motor license agency at a single  
22 location and shall be prohibited from operating subagencies or  
23 branch agencies, unless such subagencies or branch agencies were  
24 established prior to June 1, 1985.

1 Unless otherwise specifically provided, motor license agents  
2 appointed pursuant to this subsection shall be subject to all laws  
3 relating to motor license agents and shall be subject to removal at  
4 the will of the Tax Commission.

5 B. In all other counties of this state and in municipalities  
6 having a population of less than eight thousand five hundred (8,500)  
7 located in a county having a population in excess of one hundred  
8 thirty thousand (130,000), according to the latest Federal Decennial  
9 Census, the Tax Commission shall appoint as many motor license  
10 agents as it deems necessary to carry out the provisions of the  
11 Motor Vehicle License and Registration Act. Provided, that in  
12 counties with a population in excess of twenty-five thousand  
13 (25,000) persons, according to the latest Federal Decennial Census,  
14 having only one motor license agent serving the county, the Tax  
15 Commission shall establish at least one additional agency to serve  
16 the county.

17 Such agents shall be self-employed independent contractors, and  
18 all agents shall be under the supervision of the Tax Commission;  
19 provided, any agent authorized to issue registrations pursuant to  
20 the International Registration Plan shall also be under the  
21 supervision of the Corporation Commission, subject to rules  
22 promulgated by the Corporation Commission pursuant to the provisions  
23 of subsection E of Section ~~2~~ 1166 of this ~~act~~ title. Any such  
24 agent, upon being appointed, shall furnish and file with the Tax

1 Commission a bond in such amount as may be fixed by the Tax  
2 Commission. Such agent shall be removable at the will of the Tax  
3 Commission. Such agent shall perform all duties and do such things  
4 in the administration of the laws of this state as shall be enjoined  
5 upon and required by the Tax Commission or the Corporation  
6 Commission. Provided, the Tax Commission may operate a motor  
7 license agency in any county where a vacancy occurs.

8 C. In the event of a vacancy existing by reason of resignation,  
9 removal, death or otherwise, in the position of any motor license  
10 agent, the Tax Commission is hereby empowered and authorized to take  
11 any and all actions it deems appropriate in order to provide for the  
12 orderly transition and for the maintenance of operations of the  
13 motor license agency including but not limited to the designation of  
14 one of its regular employees to serve as "acting agent" without  
15 bond, and to receive and expend all fees or charges authorized or  
16 provided by law and exercise the same powers and authority as a  
17 regularly appointed motor license agent. An acting agent may be  
18 authorized by the Tax Commission equally as the preceding agent to  
19 make disbursements from any balances in the preceding motor license  
20 agent's operating account and the agent's operating funds for the  
21 payment of expenses of operations and salaries and other overhead.  
22 If such funds are insufficient, the Tax Commission is authorized to  
23 expend from funds appropriated for the operation of the Tax  
24 Commission such amounts as are necessary to maintain and continue

1 the operation of any such motor license agency until a successor  
2 agent is appointed and qualified. The Tax Commission may require a  
3 blanket fiduciary bond of the agency employees.

4 D. Any motor license agency operated by a motor license agent  
5 who has been charged with a felony shall be closed immediately. The  
6 State Auditor and Inspector shall immediately conduct an audit of  
7 such motor license agency and forward the report of the audit to the  
8 Tax Commission for review. The Tax Commission shall determine  
9 whether the motor license agency shall be reopened and operated by  
10 the motor license agent or whether the agency shall be reopened and  
11 operated by the Tax Commission. The review of the audit and the Tax  
12 Commission determination shall be effected as soon as possible to  
13 prevent additional inconvenience to the public.

14 E. When an application for registration is made with the Tax  
15 Commission, Corporation Commission or a motor license agent, a  
16 registration fee of One Dollar and seventy-five cents (\$1.75) shall  
17 be collected for each license plate or decal issued. Such fees  
18 shall be in addition to the registration fees on motor vehicles and  
19 when an application for registration is made to the motor license  
20 agent such motor license agent shall retain a fee as provided in  
21 Section 1141.1 of this title. When the fee is paid by a person  
22 making application directly with the Tax Commission or Corporation  
23 Commission, as applicable, the registration fees shall be in the  
24 same amount as provided for motor license agents and the fee

1 provided by Section 1141.1 of this title shall be deposited in the  
2 Oklahoma Tax Commission Revolving Fund or as provided in Section 3  
3 1167 of this ~~act~~ title, as applicable. The Tax Commission shall  
4 prepare schedules of registration fees and charges for titles which  
5 shall include the fees for such agents and all fees and charges paid  
6 by a person shall be listed separately on the application and  
7 registration and totaled on the application and registration. The  
8 motor license agents shall charge only such fees as are specifically  
9 provided for by law, and all such authorized fees shall be posted in  
10 such a manner that any person shall have notice of all fees that are  
11 imposed by law.

12 F. No person shall be appointed as a motor license agent unless  
13 the person has attested under oath that the person is not related by  
14 affinity or consanguinity within the third degree to:

15 1. Any member of the Oklahoma Legislature;

16 2. Any person who has served as a member of the Oklahoma  
17 Legislature within the two-year period preceding the date of  
18 appointment as motor license agent; or

19 3. Any employee of the Tax Commission.

20 G. Any motor license agent appointed under the provisions of  
21 this title shall be responsible for all costs incurred by the Tax  
22 Commission when relocating an existing motor license agency. The  
23 Tax Commission may waive payment of such costs in case of unforeseen  
24 business or emergency conditions beyond the control of the agent.
