10 An Act relating to public health and safety; amending
11 36 O.S. 2001, Section 6060.4, as last amended by
12 Section 65, Chapter 264, O.S.L. 2006 (36 O.S. Supp.
13 2007, Section 6060.4), which relates to child
immunization coverage; expanding coverage; providing
for reimbursement; and providing an effective date.

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16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

17 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 36 O.S. 2001, Section 6060.4, as
18 last amended by Section 65, Chapter 264, O.S.L. 2006 (36 O.S. Supp.
19 2007, Section 6060.4), is amended to read as follows:

20 Section 6060.4 A. A health benefit plan delivered, issued for
21 delivery or renewed in this state on or after January 1, 1998, that
22 provides benefits for the dependents of an insured individual shall
23 provide coverage for each child of the insured, from birth through
24 the date such child is eighteen (18) years of age for:

1 1. Immunization against:

- 2 a. diphtheria,
3 b. hepatitis B,
4 c. measles,
5 d. mumps,
6 e. pertussis,
7 f. polio,
8 g. rubella,
9 h. tetanus,
10 i. varicella,
11 j. haemophilus influenzae type B, and
12 k. hepatitis A; ~~and,~~
13 l. pneumococcus,
14 m. meningococcus,
15 n. rotavirus,
16 o. human papillomavirus, and
17 p. influenza; and

18 2. Any other immunization subsequently recommended for routine
19 use by the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practice or required
20 for children by the State Board of Health.

21 B. 1. Benefits required pursuant to subsection A of this
22 section shall not be subject to a deductible, co-payment, or
23 coinsurance requirement-; i
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1 2. Benefits required pursuant to subsection A of this section
2 shall not be discounted due to network agreements, preferred
3 provider organization (PPO) contracts, or any other contract that is
4 signed by a physician or facility providing immunizations which
5 would result in a reimbursement amount of less than one hundred
6 percent (100%) of the actual retail cost charged to the physician or
7 facility purchasing the immunization.

8 3. Reimbursement shall be at one hundred percent (100%) of the
9 actual retail cost of the immunization and an additional
10 reimbursement of twenty percent (20%) of the retail cost charged
11 which shall be for dispensing and storage of the immunizations.

12 C. 1. For purposes of this section, "health benefit plan"
13 means a plan that:

- 14 a. provides benefits for medical or surgical expenses
15 incurred as a result of a health condition, accident,
16 or sickness, and
- 17 b. is offered by any insurance company, group hospital
18 service corporation, the State and Education Employees
19 Group Insurance Board, or health maintenance
20 organization that delivers or issues for delivery an
21 individual, group, blanket, or franchise insurance
22 policy or insurance agreement, a group hospital
23 service contract, or an evidence of coverage, or, to
24 the extent permitted by the Employee Retirement Income

1 Security Act of 1974, 29 U.S.C., Section 1001 et seq.,
2 by a multiple employer welfare arrangement as defined
3 in Section 3 of the Employee Retirement Income
4 Security Act of 1974, or any other analogous benefit
5 arrangement, whether the payment is fixed or by
6 indemnity.

7 2. The term "health benefit plan" shall not include:

8 a. a plan that provides coverage:

9 (1) only for a specified disease,

10 (2) only for accidental death or dismemberment,

11 (3) for wages or payments in lieu of wages for a
12 period during which an employee is absent from
13 work because of sickness or injury, or

14 (4) as a supplement to liability insurance,

15 b. a Medicare supplemental policy as defined by Section
16 1882(g)(1) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C.,
17 Section 1395ss),

18 c. worker's compensation insurance coverage,

19 d. medical payment insurance issued as part of a motor
20 vehicle insurance policy,

21 e. a long-term care policy, including a nursing home
22 fixed indemnity policy, unless a determination is made
23 that the policy provides benefit coverage so
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1 comprehensive that the policy meets the definition of
2 a health benefit plan, or

3 f. short-term health insurance issued on a nonrenewable
4 basis with a duration of six (6) months or less.

5 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2008.
