11 CONFERENCE COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

12 An Act relating to the Board of Medicolegal
13 Investigations; requiring budgeting in certain
14 categories and amounts; requiring performance
15 measures; providing for the duties and compensation
16 of employees; limiting salary of the Chief Medical
17 Examiner; providing budgetary limitations; making
18 certain full-time-equivalent employees contingent
19 upon certain funding; providing lapse dates;
20 requiring and prohibiting certain budget practices;
21 providing an effective date; and declaring an
22 emergency.

23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

24 SECTION 1. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2008, the Board
of Medicolegal Investigations shall budget all funds in the
following categories and amounts:

5 The agency shall develop outcome-based performance measures for
6 each budget category.

7 SECTION 2. The duties and compensation of employees, not
8 otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed
9 upon the Board of Medicolegal Investigations by law shall be set by
10 the Board. The salary of the Chief Medical Examiner shall not
11 exceed One Hundred Eighty-five Thousand Nine Hundred Fifty-five
12 Dollars (\$185,955.00) per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year
13 ending June 30, 2008. The Board of Medicolegal Investigations for
14 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2008, shall be subject to the
15 following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent employees
16 and expenditures excluding expenditures for capital and special
17 projects, except as may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of
18 Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

22 SECTION 3. Of the total number of full-time-equivalent
23 employees authorized for the Board of Medicolegal Investigations,

1 two shall be employed contingent upon sufficient federal grant
2 funding to support them.

3 SECTION 4. Appropriations made by Section 116 of Enrolled
4 Senate Bill No. 334 of the 1st Session of the 51st Oklahoma
5 Legislature, not including appropriations made for capital outlay
6 purposes, may be budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2008
7 (hereafter FY-08) or may be budgeted for the fiscal year ending June
8 30, 2009 (hereafter FY-09). Funds budgeted for FY-08 may be
9 encumbered only through June 30, 2008, and must be expended by
10 November 15, 2008. Any funds remaining after November 15, 2008, and
11 not budgeted for FY-09, shall lapse to the credit of the proper fund
12 for the then current fiscal year. Funds budgeted for FY-09 may be
13 encumbered only through June 30, 2009. Any funds remaining after
14 November 15, 2009, shall lapse to the credit of the proper fund for
15 the then current fiscal year. These appropriations may not be
16 budgeted in both fiscal years simultaneously. Funds budgeted in FY-
17 08, and not required to pay obligations for that fiscal year, may be
18 budgeted for FY-09, after the agency to which the funds have been
19 appropriated has prepared and submitted a budget work program
20 revision removing these funds from the FY-08 budget work program and
21 after such revision has been approved by the Office of State
22 Finance.

23 SECTION 5. This act shall become effective July 1, 2007.

1 SECTION 6. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
2 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
3 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
4 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
