11 CONFERENCE COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

12 An Act relating to the Oklahoma School of Science and  
13 Mathematics; requiring expenditure of certain sum for  
14 certain purpose; requiring budgeting in certain  
15 categories and amounts; requiring performance  
16 measures; providing for duties and compensation of  
17 employees; limiting the maximum salary of the  
18 Director; providing budgetary limitations; making  
19 certain students eligible for certain programs;  
20 requiring budgeting of certain funds in certain  
21 years; providing lapse dates; requiring certain  
22 budget procedures; prohibiting certain budget  
23 procedures; providing an effective date; and  
24 declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. Of the funds appropriated in Section 14 of Enrolled  
House Bill No. 2276 of the 2nd Session of the 51st Oklahoma  
Legislature, the sum of Two Million Sixty-three Thousand One Hundred

1 Twenty-five Dollars (\$2,063,125.00) shall be expended for the  
2 purpose of developing and offering pilot outreach programs in  
3 science and mathematics as directed in Section 1210.404 of Title 70  
4 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

5 SECTION 2. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009, the Board  
6 of Trustees of the Oklahoma School of Science and Mathematics shall  
7 budget all funds in the following categories and amounts:

15 The Board of Trustees shall develop outcome-based performance  
16 measures for each budget category.

17 SECTION 3. The duties and compensation of employees, not  
18 otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed  
19 upon the Oklahoma School of Science and Mathematics by law shall be  
20 set by the Director. The salary of the Director shall not exceed  
21 Seventy-five Thousand Six Hundred Eighty-five Dollars (\$75,685.00)  
22 per annum, payable monthly for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009.  
23 The Oklahoma School of Science and Mathematics for the fiscal year  
24 ending June 30, 2009, shall be subject to the following budgetary

1 limitations on full-time-equivalent employees and expenditures  
2 excluding expenditures for capital and special projects, except as  
3 may be authorized pursuant to the provisions of Section 3603 of  
4 Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

7 SECTION 4. Students who are enrolled in a consolidated school  
8 district shall be eligible to apply to attend regional pilot  
9 outreach programs in science and mathematics as directed in Section  
10 1210.404 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes if all or part of the  
11 consolidated school district is served by the technology center  
12 school district.

13 SECTION 5. Appropriations made by Section 14 of Enrolled House  
14 Bill No. 2276 of the 2nd Session of the 51st Oklahoma Legislature,  
15 not including appropriations made for capital outlay purposes, may  
16 be budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009 (hereafter FY-  
17 09) or may be budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010  
18 (hereafter FY-10). Funds budgeted for FY-09 may be encumbered only  
19 through June 30, 2009, and must be expended by November 15, 2009.  
20 Any funds remaining after November 15, 2009, and not budgeted for  
21 FY-10, shall lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then  
22 current fiscal year. Funds budgeted for FY-10 may be encumbered  
23 only through June 30, 2010. Any funds remaining after November 15,  
24 2010, shall lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then

1 current fiscal year. These appropriations may not be budgeted in  
2 both fiscal years simultaneously. Funds budgeted in FY-09, and not  
3 required to pay obligations for that fiscal year, may be budgeted  
4 for FY-10, after the agency to which the funds have been  
5 appropriated has prepared and submitted a budget work program  
6 revision removing these funds from the FY-09 budget work program and  
7 after such revision has been approved by the Office of State  
8 Finance.

9 SECTION 6. This act shall become effective July 1, 2008.

10 SECTION 7. It being immediately necessary for the preservation  
11 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby  
12 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and  
13 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
