CONFERENCE COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

An Act relating to the Office of the State Bond  
Advisor; requiring budgeting in certain categories  
and amounts; requiring certain performance measures;  
providing for duties and compensation of employees;  
providing budgetary limitations; providing lapse  
dates; requiring and prohibiting certain budget  
procedures; providing an effective date; and  
declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009, the Office  
of the State Bond Advisor shall budget all funds in the following  
categories and amounts:

<u>Category</u>	<u>Appropriation</u>	<u>Total</u>
General Operations	\$186,419.00	\$363,000.00

1 The agency shall develop outcome-based performance measures for  
2 each budget category.

3 SECTION 2. The duties and compensation of employees, not  
4 otherwise prescribed by law, necessary to perform the duties imposed  
5 upon the Office of the State Bond Advisor by law shall be set by the  
6 Office of the State Bond Advisor. The Office of the State Bond  
7 Advisor for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009, shall be subject  
8 to the following budgetary limitations on full-time-equivalent  
9 employees and expenditures excluding expenditures for capital and  
10 special projects, except as may be authorized pursuant to the  
11 provisions of Section 3603 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes:

15 SECTION 3. Appropriations made by Section 43 of Enrolled House  
16 Bill No. 2276 of the 2nd Session of the 51st Oklahoma Legislature,  
17 not including appropriations made for capital outlay purposes, may  
18 be budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009 (hereafter FY-  
19 09) or may be budgeted for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2010  
20 (hereafter FY-10). Funds budgeted for FY-09 may be encumbered only  
21 through June 30, 2009, and must be expended by November 15, 2009.  
22 Any funds remaining after November 15, 2009, and not budgeted for  
23 FY-10, shall lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then  
24 current fiscal year. Funds budgeted for FY-10 may be encumbered

1 only through June 30, 2010. Any funds remaining after November 15,  
2 2010, shall lapse to the credit of the proper fund for the then  
3 current fiscal year. These appropriations may not be budgeted in  
4 both fiscal years simultaneously. Funds budgeted in FY-09, and not  
5 required to pay obligations for that fiscal year, may be budgeted  
6 for FY-10, after the agency to which the funds have been  
7 appropriated has prepared and submitted a budget work program  
8 revision removing these funds from the FY-09 budget work program and  
9 after such revision has been approved by the Office of State  
10 Finance.

11 SECTION 4. This act shall become effective July 1, 2008.

12 SECTION 5. It being immediately necessary for the preservation  
13 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby  
14 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and  
15 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
