10 COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE

11 An Act relating to roads, bridges and ferries;
12 requiring certain reports; amending 69 O.S. 2001,
13 Section 302.2, which relates to the Department of
14 Transportation Tribal Advisory Board; clarifying
15 language; providing for noncodification; providing an
16 effective date; and declaring an emergency.

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

18 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
19 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

20 The Transportation Commission shall annually provide a report to
21 the House of Representatives and the Senate describing the county
22 road projects funded through the County Improvements for Roads and
23 Bridges Fund as created in Section 507 of Title 69 of the Oklahoma
24 Statutes.

1 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 69 O.S. 2001, Section 302.2, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 Section 302.2 A. There is hereby created the Department of
4 Transportation Tribal Advisory Board. The Board shall consist of
5 nine (9) members. The Governor, President Pro Tempore of the Senate
6 and Speaker of the House of Representatives shall make three
7 appointments each from a list of qualified persons nominated by the
8 Oklahoma Tribal Transportation Council. Four members shall be
9 members of tribes served by each Bureau of Indian Affairs Area
10 Office in Oklahoma and one member shall be selected at large by the
11 Governor. Each member shall hold office for a two-year term or
12 until the successor of the member takes office. Their terms of
13 office shall begin on July 1 of the succeeding fiscal year.

14 B. It shall be the duty of the Board to act in an advisory
15 capacity to the Director of the Department of Transportation. The
16 Board may review the Department's policy and procedures for
17 transportation programs ~~that~~ which affect tribal governments. The
18 Board shall meet no less than on a quarterly basis with the Director
19 of the Department of Transportation and the staff of the Director to
20 discuss areas of mutual concern.

21 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2007.

22 SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
23 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
24

1 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
2 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
