16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

17 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 10 O.S. 2001, Section 7303-8.6, as  
18 amended by Section 10, Chapter 124, O.S.L. 2006 (10 O.S. Supp. 2006,  
19 Section 7303-8.6), is amended to read as follows:

20 Section 7303-8.6 When a child is committed to the custody of  
21 the ~~Department of Juvenile Justice~~ Office of Juvenile Affairs under  
22 the provisions of this article, the court shall order the child to  
23 be delivered by the sheriff or by a private contractor pursuant to  
24 the provisions of Section 7304-1.3 of this title to an institution,

1 or other place, designated by the ~~Department, and the~~ Office of  
2 Juvenile Affairs. The cost of transportation shall be ~~paid from the~~  
3 ~~county's general fund~~ reimbursed by the Office of Juvenile Affairs  
4 as follows:

5 1. A fee for the cost of personnel services at the rate of  
6 Twelve Dollars (\$12.00) per hour;

7 2. Mileage reimbursement for each mile actually traveled at the  
8 rate established in the State Travel Reimbursement Act;

9 3. Meals for transporting personnel, not to exceed Six Dollars  
10 (\$6.00) per meal; and

11 4. Meals for juveniles being transported, not to exceed Six  
12 Dollars (\$6.00) per meal.

13 ~~The Department of Juvenile Justice~~ Office of Juvenile Affairs  
14 shall not be ordered to provide transportation as provided for in  
15 this section for a juvenile who has been committed to the custody of  
16 the ~~Department~~ Office of Juvenile Affairs and is destined for a  
17 secure institution.

18 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2007.
