10 An act relating to mental health; amending Section 2,
11 Chapter 354, O.S.L. 2003, as amended by Section 11,
12 Chapter 195, O.S.L. 2005 (43A O.S. Supp. 2006,
13 Section 2-311), which relates to the Community-based
14 Substance Abuse Revolving Fund; expanding permissible
15 expenditures; and providing an effective date.

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

17 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 2, Chapter 354, O.S.L.
18 2003, as amended by Section 11, Chapter 195, O.S.L. 2005 (43A O.S.
19 Supp. 2006, Section 2-311), is amended to read as follows:

20 Section 2-311. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a
21 revolving fund for the Department of Mental Health and Substance
22 Abuse Services to be designated the Community-based Substance Abuse
23 Revolving Fund. The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to
24 fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of all monies received by
the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services from

1 low-point beer permits pursuant to Section 163.7 of Title 37 of the
2 Oklahoma Statutes, enrollment fees for alcohol and drug substance
3 abuse courses pursuant to the provisions of Section 3-453 of this
4 title, and fees from certification of assessment agencies and
5 assessment personnel pursuant to the provisions of Section 3-460 of
6 this title. All monies accruing to the credit of the fund are
7 hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the
8 Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services for the
9 purpose of providing training and administrative services pursuant
10 to the provisions of Sections 3-453 and 3-460 of this title, ~~and~~
11 contracting with private facilities, organizations and tribal
12 programs to provide treatment, counseling, rehabilitation, and other
13 related services directed toward alcohol- and drug-dependent
14 persons, and contracting with statewide substance abuse
15 organizations to provide training and to establish and maintain a
16 collaborative network of providers to maintain and improve the
17 continuum of care between agencies that provide substance abuse
18 prevention, treatment, and advocacy programs using best practices
19 and innovative programs that focus on substance abuse services and
20 co-occurring disorders. Expenditures from the fund shall be made
21 upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as
22 prescribed by law with the Director of State Finance for approval
23 and payment.

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SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2007.
