10 An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2001,
11 Sections 3-150 and 3-151, which relate to the
12 Academic Performance Index; modifying indicators
13 comprising index; specifying certain methods of
14 calculation; specifying contents of certain report;
15 and providing an effective date.

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

17 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2001, Section 3-150, is
18 amended to read as follows:

19 Section 3-150. A. The State Board of Education shall develop
20 an Academic Performance Index (API) to be used to measure
21 performance of schools, including the academic performance of
22 students. The index shall consist of a variety of indicators
23 including, but not limited to:

- 24 1. Attendance rates for students;
2. Dropout rates;

1 3. Results of ~~the~~ all assessments administered pursuant to the
2 Oklahoma School Testing Program administered pursuant to Section
3 1210.508 of this title Act;

4 4. Percentages of secondary students who enroll in the core
5 curriculum as an alternative to the college preparatory/work ready
6 curriculum;

7 5. Advanced Placement participation;

8 ~~5- 6.~~ 6. Graduation rates for secondary school students calculated
9 pursuant to the compact formula adopted by the National Governors
10 Association;

11 7. SAT scores;

12 ~~6- 8.~~ 8. Scores of the American College Test (ACT) ACT scores; and

13 ~~7- 9.~~ 9. College remediation rates, reflected as the percentage of
14 students who score nineteen (19) or below for each subject area of
15 the ACT.

16 B. The data collected for the API shall be disaggregated, when
17 available, by socioeconomic status and ethnic group. Oklahoma
18 School Testing Program results shall constitute no less than sixty
19 percent (60%) of the value of the index.

20 C. Based on the API, the State Board of Education shall adopt
21 expected annual percentage growth targets for the state level,
22 school districts, and all school sites based on their API baseline
23 score. The minimum percentage growth target shall be five percent
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1 (5%) annually. However, the State Board of Education may set
2 differential growth targets based on grade level of instruction.

3 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2001, Section 3-151, is
4 amended to read as follows:

5 Section 3-151. A. On or before December 31, 1999, the State
6 Board of Education shall file a report with the Governor and the
7 Legislature setting out the plan for establishing the Academic
8 Performance Index. Thereafter, on or before December 31 and every
9 year thereafter the Board shall file a report with the Governor and
10 the Legislature on the state, district, and site results of this
11 program. The report shall present information in a format which
12 provides annual comparative data to show performance over a period
13 of time, the growth target and an indication of whether the growth
14 target was attained for each school site, district, and the state.

15 B. On or before July 13, 2001, the State Board of Education
16 shall file a report with the Governor and the Legislature setting
17 out the draft formula to be used for the Academic Performance Index.

18 C. On or before September 30, 2001, the State Board of
19 Education shall file a report with the Governor and the Legislature
20 setting out the formula to be used for the Academic Performance
21 Index.

22 D. On or before February 28, 2002, the State Board of Education
23 shall file a report with the Governor and the Legislature containing
24 the final baseline Academic Performance Index.

1 E. The State Department of Education shall notify school
2 districts of the status of implementation of the Academic
3 Performance Index, including the deadlines and information to be
4 reported as required in subsections B, C and D of this section.

5 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2007.

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
