20 A Concurrent Resolution designating April 2, 2008, as
21 "4-H Day" at the Oklahoma State Capitol; urging the
22 people of the state to become more aware of this
23 special program; and directing distribution.

1 WHEREAS, 4-H is a community of young people across America who
2 are learning leadership, citizenship, and life skills; and

3 WHEREAS, Oklahoma 4-H will kick off its Centennial year in July
4 2008 at State 4-H Roundup; and

5 WHEREAS, 4-H is the largest youth organization in Oklahoma,
6 annually reaching nearly one hundred fifty thousand (150,000) youth
7 between the ages of five and nineteen through the fourfold
8 development of the Head, Heart, Hands, and Health of every member;
9 and

10 WHEREAS, 4-H in Oklahoma is supported by a network of six
11 hundred fifty (650) youth volunteers and three thousand two hundred
12 (3,200) adult volunteers, whose annual community service is
13 estimated as a Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollar (\$750,000.00)
14 investment in the future we all share; and

15 WHEREAS, 4-H as part of the Oklahoma Cooperative Extension
16 Service provided by Langston University and Oklahoma State
17 University, is a program where youth learn together through various
18 kinds of projects, events, and activities; and

19 WHEREAS, 4-H has been helping youth and adults to learn, grow,
20 and work together, impacting their club, community, Oklahoma, and
21 the world.

22 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
23 OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 51ST OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE SENATE
24 CONCURRING THEREIN:

1 THAT the Legislature hereby proclaims April 2, 2008, as 4-H Day
2 at the Capitol.

3 THAT the Legislature urges the people of this state to take
4 advantage of the opportunity to become more aware of this special
5 program which gives youth the chance to learn together and on their
6 own as part of 4-H and to join us in recognizing the unique
7 partnership between our county, state, and federal governments and
8 our Land-grant University System.

9 THAT a copy of this Resolution be distributed to the Department
10 of Agricultural Education, Communications and 4-H Youth Development
11 at Oklahoma State University and the Oklahoma Cooperative Extension
12 Service at Oklahoma State University.
