13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

14 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2001, Section 1000.5, as
15 amended by Section 2, Chapter 457, O.S.L. 2002 (59 O.S. Supp. 2007,
16 Section 1000.5), is amended to read as follows:

17 Section 1000.5 A. The Construction Industries Board may
18 establish a system of fees to be charged for the application for
19 licenses, for the issuance and renewal of licenses and permits, for
20 administration of examinations ~~and~~, for formal project reviews and
21 dishonored checks under the Board's authority. This provision is
22 subject to the following limitations:

23 1. No schedule of fees may be established or amended by the
24 Board except during such times as the Legislature is in session;

1 provided, the Board may establish or amend a schedule of fees at a
2 time when the Legislature is not in session if the fees or schedule
3 of fees has been specifically authorized by the Legislature pursuant
4 to paragraph 2 of this subsection. The Board must follow the
5 procedures required by Article I of the Administrative Procedures
6 Act for adoption of rules in establishing or amending any such
7 schedule of fees; and

8 2. The Board shall charge fees only within the following
9 ranges, except as may be otherwise specified in this section.

10	For application for license	not to exceed \$30.00
11	For administration of license	
12	examinations:	not to exceed \$200.00
13	For license or permit issuance:	not to exceed \$300.00
14	For license or permit renewal:	not to exceed \$200.00
15	For formal project review for	
16	code conformance:	not to exceed \$200.00
17	For permit issuance for the use	
18	of alternative materials or	
19	methods:	not to exceed \$50.00
20	<u>For dishonored checks:</u>	<u>not to exceed amount</u>
21		<u>pursuant to the</u>
22		<u>provisions of Section</u>
23		<u>1121 of Title 47 of the</u>
24		<u>Oklahoma Statutes.</u>

1 B. The Board shall base its schedule of fees upon the
2 reasonable costs of review and inspection services rendered in
3 connection with each license, permit, or review, but shall be within
4 the ranges specified in paragraph 2 of subsection A of this section,
5 except as otherwise specified in this section. The Board shall
6 establish a system of training for all personnel who render review
7 and inspection services in order to assure uniform statewide
8 application of rules. The Board shall include the reasonable costs
9 associated with such training in the fees provided for in this
10 section.

11 C. The Board may exempt by rule any class of licensee or
12 permittee from the requirements of the fee schedule if the Board
13 determines that the creation of such a schedule for any such class
14 would create an unreasonable economic hardship.

15 D. All statutory fees now in effect for the issuance and
16 renewal of any license, permit, or review under the authority of the
17 Construction Industries Board shall remain in effect until such time
18 as the Board, by its rulemaking authority, acts to implement new fee
19 schedules pursuant to the provisions of this section.

20 E. Unless otherwise provided, licenses and permits issued by
21 the Construction Industries Board shall be for a one-year period.

22 F. When, at the time of application or renewal of any license
23 or registration, payment is made by check for fees and the check is
24 not paid by the bank on which drawn for any reason, such license or

1 registration issued at that time shall be invalid. In all such
2 cases, the license or registration shall be subject to the license
3 or registration fees and penalties provided in subsection A of this
4 section and treated as though no attempt to apply for or renew a
5 license or registration had been made. The Board may charge and
6 collect from the licensee, registrant or other obligor of fees or
7 finer, a fee for each return by a bank or other depository
8 institution of a dishonored check, negotiable order of withdrawal or
9 share draft issued by the licensee, registrant or other obligor.

10 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2001, Section 1002, as
11 amended by Section 7, Chapter 318, O.S.L. 2003 (59 O.S. Supp. 2007,
12 Section 1002), is amended to read as follows:

13 Section 1002. A. The Construction Industries Board is hereby
14 authorized, empowered, and directed to make, prescribe, enforce,
15 amend, and repeal rules governing the following:

16 1. The examination and licensing of persons desiring or
17 intending to engage in the business, trade or calling of plumbing
18 contractor or journeyman plumber;

19 2. The registering of and issuing of certificates to persons
20 desiring or intending to work or act as a plumber's apprentice;

21 3. The establishment and levying of administrative fines;

22 4. The initiation of disciplinary proceedings;

23 5. The requesting of prosecution of and initiation of
24 injunctive proceedings against any person who violates any of the

1 provisions of The Plumbing License Law of 1955 or any rule
2 promulgated pursuant to The Plumbing License Law of 1955; and

3 6. The establishment of minimum standards of plumbing
4 installation through the adoption of standards published by a
5 recognized code body; and

6 7. The establishment of bonding and insurance requirements for
7 the issuance of a license as a plumbing contractor; provided, such
8 rules shall not be inconsistent with the terms and conditions
9 hereinafter provided.

10 B. Such bonding requirements shall allow the filing of cash or
11 a certificate of deposit in lieu of a bond. A state bond or cash or
12 certificate of deposit filed in lieu of a bond and which is posted
13 pursuant to the provisions of this section shall be deemed
14 sufficient to meet the requirements of any municipality, provided
15 that a copy of said bond or documentation of cash or certificate of
16 deposit filed in lieu of a bond shall be filed by the contractor
17 prior to the commencement of any plumbing work with any municipality
18 in which the licensee does work ~~as a plumbing contractor. A copy of~~
19 ~~the bond or documentation of cash or certificate of deposit filed in~~
20 ~~lieu of a bond shall be filed with the municipality prior to the~~
21 ~~commencement of any such work by the licensee~~ if required by local
22 ordinances or rules.

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1 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2001, Section 1009, as
2 amended by Section 8, Chapter 318, O.S.L. 2003 (59 O.S. Supp. 2007,
3 Section 1009), is amended to read as follows:

4 Section 1009. ~~Until June 30, 2004, no~~ No license shall be
5 issued for longer than one (1) year and all licenses shall expire on
6 ~~June 30th of each year and such~~ the last day in the birth month of
7 the licensee. Such licenses may be renewed upon application and
8 payment of fees within thirty (30) days preceding or following ~~June~~
9 ~~30th of each year, or~~ the date the license renewal is due.

10 ~~Beginning July 1, 2004, all licenses shall expire on the birth date~~
11 ~~of the licensee. The Construction Industries Board shall establish~~
12 ~~by rule a method for prorating license fees to coincide with the~~
13 ~~birth date of the licensee. No journeyman or contractor license~~
14 shall be renewed unless the licensee has completed the required
15 hours of continuing education as determined and approved by the
16 Committee. ~~Such requirement may be satisfied by completing a course~~
17 ~~on the current edition of the International Fuel Gas Code or the~~
18 ~~International Plumbing Code revision of not less than six (6) hours~~
19 ~~of instruction within one (1) year of adoption of the current~~
20 ~~International Plumbing Code revision.~~ The Committee may renew
21 licenses upon application made more than thirty (30) days following
22 the date of expiration only upon payment of the renewal and
23 additional fee prescribed and upon compliance with any applicable
24 continuing education requirements as established by the Board and

1 this act. Provided that no penalty for renewal shall be charged to
2 any holder of a license which expires while such holder is in
3 military service if application is made within one (1) year
4 following ~~his service~~ discharge from the military service.

5 Apprentice registration certificates expire one (1) year after
6 date of registration, at which time the apprentice may reregister.

7 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2001, Section 1010, is
8 amended to read as follows:

9 Section 1010. A. The designee of the Construction Industries
10 Board, as chair, and the members of the Oklahoma State Committee of
11 Plumbing Examiners shall constitute a Plumbing Hearing Board, which
12 may on its own motion make investigations and conduct hearings. The
13 Plumbing Hearing Board may, on its own motion or upon complaint in
14 writing duly signed and verified by the complainant, and upon not
15 less than ten (10) days' notice to the licensee, suspend any license
16 or registration issued under The Plumbing License Law of 1955, and
17 may revoke such license or registration in the manner hereinafter
18 provided, if by clear and convincing evidence it finds that the
19 holder of the license has:

20 1. Made a material misstatement in the application for license
21 or renewal thereof;

22 2. Loaned or illegally used the license;

23 3. Demonstrated incompetency to act as a journeyman plumber or
24 plumbing contractor, as the case may be;

1 4. Violated any provision of The Plumbing License Law of 1955,
2 or any rule or order prescribed by the Construction Industries
3 Board, or any ordinance or regulation for the installation of
4 plumbing made or enacted by a city, town, or sewer Board by
5 authority of The Plumbing License Law of 1955; or

6 5. Willfully and unreasonably failed to perform his or her
7 normal business obligations without justifiable cause.

8 B. A copy of the complaint with notice of the suspension of
9 license, if ordered by the Plumbing Hearing Board, shall be served
10 on the person complained against, and the answer thereto shall be
11 filed in the time allowed for the filing of answers in legal
12 proceedings by the statutes of this state.

13 C. Any administrative hearing on suspensions, revocations or
14 finances shall be conducted by a hearing examiner appointed by the
15 Construction Industries Board. The hearing examiner's decision
16 shall be a final decision which may be appealed to a district court
17 in accordance with the Administrative Procedures Act.

18 D. No order revoking a license shall be made until after a
19 public hearing, held in accordance with the provisions of Article II
20 of the Administrative Procedures Act, by the Plumbing Hearing Board
21 which shall not be less than thirty (30) days and not more than
22 sixty (60) days after the date of notice of suspension. The hearing
23 shall be held at the place designated by the Plumbing Hearing Board.
24 The person complained against shall have the right to be represented

1 by counsel and to introduce any evidence in defense. The conduct of
2 the hearing shall be in accordance with recognized rules of legal
3 procedure and any member of the Plumbing Hearing Board or a
4 representative designated by the Plumbing Hearing Board shall have
5 authority to administer oaths and take testimony.

6 ~~D.~~ E. Any person whose license or registration has been revoked
7 may, after the expiration of one (1) year from the date of such
8 revocation, but not before, apply for a new license.

9 ~~E.~~ F. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a political
10 subdivision of this state that has adopted a nationally recognized
11 plumbing code and appointed an inspector pursuant to Section 1016 of
12 this title or pursuant to the Oklahoma Inspectors Act for such work
13 shall have jurisdiction over the interpretation of the code and the
14 installation of all plumbing work done in that political
15 subdivision, subject to the provisions of the Oklahoma Inspectors
16 Act. Provided, a state inspector may work directly with a plumbing
17 contractor or journeyman plumber in such a locality if a violation
18 of the code creates an immediate threat to life or health.

19 ~~F.~~ G. In the case of a complaint about, investigation of, or
20 inspection of any license, registration, permit or plumbing in any
21 political subdivision of this state which has not adopted a
22 nationally recognized plumbing code and appointed an inspector
23 pursuant to Section 1016 of this title or pursuant to the Oklahoma
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1 Inspectors Act for such work, the Construction Industries Board
2 shall have jurisdiction over such matters.

3 ~~G.~~ H. 1. No individual, business, company, corporation,
4 limited liability company, association or other entity subject to
5 the provisions of ~~Section 1001 et seq. of this title~~ the Plumbing
6 License Law of 1955 shall install, modify or alter plumbing in any
7 incorporated area of this state which has not adopted a nationally
8 recognized plumbing code and appointed an inspector pursuant to
9 Section 1016 of this title or pursuant to the Oklahoma Inspectors
10 Act for such work without providing notice of such plumbing to the
11 Construction Industries Board. A notice form for reproduction by an
12 individual or entity required to make such notice shall be provided
13 by the Construction Industries Board upon request.

14 2. Notice to the Construction Industries Board pursuant to this
15 subsection shall not be required for plumbing maintenance or
16 replacement of an existing plumbing device or fixture, unless such
17 device is gas fired, or of any petroleum refinery or its research
18 facilities.

19 3. Enforcement of this subsection is authorized pursuant to The
20 Plumbing License Law of 1955, or under authority granted to the
21 Construction Industries Board.

22 SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2001, Section 1019, is
23 amended to read as follows:

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1 Section 1019. A. Any person, firm, partnership, association or
2 corporation who shall violate any of the provisions of this act, or
3 any provision of an ordinance or regulation enacted by a city, town,
4 or sewer commission, by authority of this act shall, in addition to
5 suffering possible suspension or revocation of a license, be guilty
6 of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a
7 fine of not less than Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) nor more than One
8 Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), together with the costs of prosecution.

9 B. The Plumbing Hearing Board may make application to the
10 appropriate court for an order enjoining the acts or practices
11 prohibited by this act, and upon a showing by the Plumbing Hearing
12 Board that the person or firm has engaged in any of the prohibited
13 acts or practices, an injunction, restraining order or other order
14 as may be appropriate shall be granted by the court.

15 SECTION 6. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2001, Section 1683, as
16 amended by Section 7, Chapter 457, O.S.L. 2002 (59 O.S. Supp. 2007,
17 Section 1683), is amended to read as follows:

18 Section 1683. A. There is hereby established the Committee of
19 Electrical Examiners which shall consist of seven (7) members. All
20 members of the Committee shall be residents of this state.

21 B. Beginning January 1, 2002, as the terms of members serving
22 on the Committee expire, six voting members of the Committee shall
23 be appointed by the Construction Industries Board as follows:

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1 1. One member shall be an electrical inspector selected from a
2 list of names submitted by a statewide organization of electrical
3 inspectors;

4 2. One member shall be selected from a list of names submitted
5 by a statewide organization of electrical contractors representing
6 union contractors;

7 3. One member shall be selected from a list of names submitted
8 by a statewide organization representing builders and contractors;

9 4. One member shall be a journeyman wireman selected from a
10 list of names submitted by a statewide organization of union
11 journeymen wiremen;

12 5. One member shall be a journeyman wireman selected from lists
13 of names submitted from the electrical construction industry; and

14 6. One member shall be selected from a list of names submitted
15 by a statewide organization of electrical contractors representing
16 nonunion contractors. The term of the initial appointee shall be
17 for two (2) years.

18 All members shall each have at least ten (10) years of active
19 experience as licensed electrical contractors, journeyman
20 electricians or as an electrical inspector. No member shall be
21 employed by the same person or firm as any other member of the
22 Committee. The terms of members so appointed shall be staggered and
23 shall be for two (2) years, or until their successors are appointed
24 and qualified.

1 The nonvoting member shall be designated by the Board from its
2 staff to serve ~~as Program Administrator and serve as the Chief~~
3 ~~Electrical Inspector for the state~~ on the Committee at the will of
4 the Board.

5 C. Vacancies which may occur in the membership of the Committee
6 shall be filled by appointment of the Board. Each person who has
7 been appointed to fill a vacancy shall serve for the remainder of
8 the term for which the member he or she succeeds was appointed and
9 until his or her successor has been appointed and has qualified.
10 Members of the Committee may be removed from office by the Board for
11 cause in the manner provided by law for the removal of officers not
12 subject to impeachment.

13 D. The Committee shall assist and advise the Board on all
14 matters relating to the formulation of rules and standards in
15 accordance with the Electrical License Act. The Committee shall
16 administer the examinations of applicants for licenses as electrical
17 contractors or journeyman electricians provided that such
18 examinations shall be in accordance with the provisions of the
19 Electrical License Act. The Committee may authorize the Board to
20 conduct tests on their behalf as the Committee deems necessary.

21 E. All members of the Committee shall be reimbursed for
22 expenses incurred while in the performance of their duties in
23 accordance with the State Travel Reimbursement Act.

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1 F. A majority of the total membership of the Committee shall
2 constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

3 G. The Committee shall elect from among its membership a
4 ~~chairperson~~ chair, ~~vice chairperson~~ vice-chair and secretary to
5 serve terms of not more than one (1) year ending on June 30 of the
6 year designated as the end of the officer's term. The ~~chairperson~~
7 chair or ~~vice chairperson~~ vice-chair shall preside at all meetings.
8 The ~~chairperson~~ chair, ~~vice chairperson~~ vice-chair and secretary
9 shall perform such duties as may be directed by the Committee. The
10 Committee shall meet at such times as the ~~chairperson~~ chair or
11 presiding officer deems necessary to carry out the responsibilities
12 of the Board.

13 SECTION 7. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2001, Section 1688, as
14 last amended by Section 12, Chapter 318, O.S.L. 2003 (59 O.S. Supp.
15 2007, Section 1688), is amended to read as follows:

16 Section 1688. A. ~~Until June 30, 2004, no~~ No license shall be
17 issued for longer than one (1) year, and all licenses shall expire
18 ~~on June 30 of each year~~ on the last day in the birth month of the
19 licensee. A license may be renewed upon application and payment of
20 fees thirty (30) days preceding or following ~~June 30 of each year,~~
21 ~~or the date the license is due, and not be subject to a late renewal~~
22 ~~penalty. Beginning July 1, 2004, all licenses shall expire on the~~
23 ~~birthdate of the licensee. The Construction Industries Board shall~~
24 ~~establish by rule a method for prorating license fees to coincide~~

1 ~~with the birthdate of the licensee. Licenses which have not been~~
2 renewed more than thirty (30) days following the date of expiration
3 may be renewed only upon application and payment of all required
4 fees and payment of any penalty for late renewal established by the
5 Board and upon compliance with any applicable continuing education
6 requirements established by the Board and this act. No penalty for
7 late renewal shall be charged to any holder of a license which
8 expires while the holder is in military service, if an application
9 for renewal is made within one (1) year following the service
10 discharge of the holder.

11 B. No journeyman or contractor license shall be renewed unless
12 the licensee has completed the required hours of continuing
13 education, as determined and approved by the Committee of Electrical
14 Examiners and approved by the Construction Industries Board. ~~The~~
15 ~~requirement may be satisfied by completing a course on the current~~
16 ~~national electrical code revision of not less than six (6) hours of~~
17 ~~instruction, within one (1) year of adoption of the current national~~
18 ~~electrical code revision.~~

19 C. An apprentice registration certificate shall be issued for
20 one (1) year, at which time the apprentice may reregister upon
21 meeting the requirements of the Construction Industries Board and
22 paying the renewal fee.

23 SECTION 8. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2001, Section 1689 is
24 amended to read as follows:

1 Section 1689. A. The Construction Industries Board or its
2 designee and the Committee of Electrical Examiners shall act as the
3 Electrical Hearing Board and shall comply with the provisions of
4 Article II of the Administrative Procedures Act, ~~Section 308a et~~
5 ~~seq. of Title 75 of the Oklahoma Statutes.~~

6 B. Any administrative hearing on suspensions, revocations or
7 finances shall be conducted by a hearing examiner appointed by the
8 Board. The hearing examiner's decision shall be a final decision
9 which may be appealed to a district court in accordance with the
10 Administrative Procedures Act.

11 C. The Electrical Hearing Board may, upon its own motion, and
12 shall, upon written complaint filed by any person, investigate the
13 business transactions of any electrical contractor, journeyman
14 electrician or electrical apprentice. Upon a finding by clear and
15 convincing evidence, the Board shall suspend or revoke any license
16 or registration obtained by false or fraudulent representation.
17 Upon a finding by clear and convincing evidence, the Board shall
18 also suspend or revoke any license or registration for any of the
19 following:

- 20 1. Making a material misstatement in the application for a
21 license or registration, or the renewal of a license or
22 registration;
- 23 2. Loaning or illegally using a license;

1 3. Demonstrating incompetence to act as a journeyman
2 electrician or electrical contractor;

3 4. Violating any provisions of the Electrical License Act, or
4 any rule or order prescribed by the Board or any ordinance for the
5 installation of electrical facilities made or enacted by a city or
6 town by authority of the Electrical License Act; or

7 5. Willfully failing to perform normal business obligations
8 without justifiable cause.

9 ~~C.~~ D. Any person whose license or registration has been revoked
10 by the Electrical Hearing Board may apply for a new license one (1)
11 year from the date of such revocation.

12 ~~D.~~ E. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a political
13 subdivision of this state that has adopted a nationally recognized
14 electrical code and appointed an inspector pursuant to the
15 provisions of Section 1693 of this title or pursuant to the
16 provisions of the Oklahoma Inspectors Act for such work shall have
17 jurisdiction over the interpretation of the code and the
18 installation of all electrical work done in that political
19 subdivision, subject to the provisions of the Oklahoma Inspectors
20 Act. Provided, a state inspector may work directly with an

18 individual or entity required to make such notice shall be provided
19 by the Construction Industries Board upon request.

20 2. Notice to the Construction Industries Board pursuant to this
21 subsection shall not be required for electrical maintenance or
22 replacement of existing electrical appliances or fixtures or of any
23 petroleum refinery or its research facilities.

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1 3. Enforcement of this subsection is authorized pursuant to the
2 Electrical License Act, or under authority granted to the
3 Construction Industries Board.

4 SECTION 9. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2001, Section 1850.8, as
5 last amended by Section 7, Chapter 163, O.S.L. 2004 (59 O.S. Supp.
6 2007, Section 1850.8), is amended to read as follows:

7 Section 1850.8 A. The Construction Industries Board shall
8 issue a license as a mechanical journeyman or mechanical contractor
9 to any person who:

10 1. Has been certified by the Committee of Mechanical Examiners
11 as having successfully passed the appropriate examination; and

12 2. Has paid the license fee and has otherwise complied with the
13 provisions of the Mechanical Licensing Act. The license fees shall
14 be established by rule by the Board pursuant to Section 1000.5 of
15 this title.

16 B. All licenses shall be nontransferable. ~~Until June 30, 2004,~~
17 ~~no~~ No license shall be issued for longer than one (1) year and all
18 licenses shall expire on ~~June 30 of each year. Beginning July 1,~~
19 ~~2004, all licenses shall expire on the~~ last day in the birth date
20 month of the licensee. ~~The Construction Industries Board shall~~
21 ~~establish by rule a method for prorating license fees to coincide~~
22 ~~with the birth date of the licensee. Licenses which have not been~~
23 renewed more than thirty (30) days following the date of expiration
24 may only be renewed upon application and payment of the required

14 ~~Code or the mechanical provisions of the International Residential~~

17 ~~of adoption of the current International Mechanical Code revision or~~
18 ~~the International Fuel Gas Code or the International Residential~~
19 ~~Code revisions.~~ Persons who are licensed as contractors under the
20 Mechanical Licensing Act may have their license placed on inactive
21 status by paying the annual renewal fee and eliminating the bonding
22 and insurance requirements. No late fee shall be charged to renew a
23 license which expired while the applicant was in military service,
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1 if application is made within one (1) year of discharge from the
2 military service.

3 C. The Board is authorized to establish and issue, subject to
4 the provisions of the Mechanical Licensing Act, limited licenses in
5 each area of mechanical work based on the experience, ability,
6 examination scores and the education of the applicant. The limited
7 licenses shall authorize the licensee to engage in only those
8 activities and within the limits specified in the license.

7 SECTION 11. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2001, Section 1850.13, as
8 amended by Section 9, Chapter 163, O.S.L. 2004 (59 O.S. Supp. 2007,
9 Section 1850.13), is amended to read as follows:

10 Section 1850.13 There is hereby created in the State Treasury a
11 revolving fund for the Construction Industries Board, to be
12 designated the "Oklahoma Mechanical Licensing Revolving Fund". The
13 fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year
14 limitations, and shall consist of all monies received by the ~~State~~
15 ~~Department of Health~~ Board pursuant to the Mechanical Licensing Act,
16 including administrative fines authorized by Section 1850.11 of this
17 title. All monies accruing to the credit of said fund are hereby
18 appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the Construction

3 Section 1850.14 A. The Construction Industries Board or its
4 designee and the Committee of Mechanical Examiners shall act as the
5 Mechanical Hearing Board and shall comply with the provisions of
6 Article II of the Administrative Procedures Act.

7 B. Any administrative hearing on suspensions, revocations or
8 finances shall be conducted by a hearing examiner appointed by the
9 Construction Industries Board. The hearing examiner's decision
10 shall be a final decision which may be appealed to a district court
11 in accordance with the Administrative Procedures Act.

12 C. The Mechanical Hearing Board may, upon its own motion, and
13 shall, upon written complaint filed by any person, investigate the
14 business transactions of any mechanical contractor, mechanical

11 by the Mechanical Hearing Board may apply for a new license one (1)
12 year from the date of such revocation.

13 ~~D.~~ E. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a political
14 subdivision of this state that has adopted a nationally recognized
15 mechanical code and appointed an inspector pursuant to Section
16 1850.12 of this title or pursuant to the Oklahoma Inspectors Act for
17 such work shall have jurisdiction over the interpretation of said
18 code and the installation of all mechanical work done in that
19 political subdivision, subject to the provisions of the Oklahoma
20 Inspectors Act. Provided, a state inspector may work directly with
21 a mechanical contractor, mechanical journeyman, mechanical
22 apprentice or mechanical firm in such a locality if a violation of

5 pursuant to Section 1850.12 of this title or pursuant to the
6 Oklahoma Inspectors Act for such work, the Board shall have
7 jurisdiction over such matters.

8 ~~F.~~ G. 1. No individual, business, company, corporation,
9 association, limited liability company, or other entity subject to
10 the provisions of the Mechanical Licensing Act shall install, modify
11 or alter mechanical systems in any incorporated area of this state
12 which has not adopted a nationally recognized mechanical code and
13 appointed an inspector pursuant to Section 1850.12 of this title or
14 pursuant to the Oklahoma Inspectors Act for such work without
15 providing notice of such mechanical work to the Board. A notice
16 form for reproduction by an individual or entity required to make
17 such notice shall be provided by the Board upon request.

18 2. Notice to the Board pursuant to this subsection shall not be
19 required for minor repair or maintenance performed according to the
20 mechanical equipment manufacturer's instructions or of any petroleum
21 refinery or its research facilities.

22 3. Enforcement of this subsection is authorized pursuant to the
23 Mechanical Licensing Act, or under authority granted to the Board.

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
