11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

12 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 59 O.S. 2001, Section 1695, is
13 amended to read as follows:

14 Section 1695. A. ~~Any~~ Except as provided in subsection B of
15 this section, any person who violates any of the provisions of the
16 Electrical License Act or any provision of an ordinance or
17 regulation enacted by a city or town by authority of the Electrical
18 License Act, in addition to suffering possible suspension or
19 revocation of a license or registration, shall, upon conviction, be
20 guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of not less
21 than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) nor more than One Hundred Dollars
22 (\$100.00).

23 B. Any person who violates the Electrical License Act by
24 engaging in or offering to engage in, by advertisement or otherwise,

1 any electrical work subject to the Electrical License Act and does
2 not possess a valid license or registration from the Construction
3 Industries Board shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a misdemeanor
4 and shall be punished by confinement in the county jail for a period
5 not to exceed one (1) year or by the imposition of a fine of not
6 less than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) nor more than One Thousand
7 Dollars (\$1,000.00), or by both such imprisonment and fine.

8 C. In addition to other penalties provided by law, if after a
9 hearing in accordance with the provisions of Section 1689 of this
10 title, the Electrical Hearing Board shall find any person to be in
11 violation of any of the provisions of this act, such person may be
12 subject to an administrative fine of not more than Five Hundred
13 Dollars (\$500.00) for each violation. Each day a person is in
14 violation of this act may constitute a separate violation. The
15 maximum fine will not exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00). All
16 administrative fines collected pursuant to the provisions of this
17 subsection shall be deposited in the Electrical Revolving Fund.
18 Administrative fines imposed pursuant to this subsection shall be
19 enforceable in the district courts of this state.

20 ~~C.~~ D. The Electrical Hearing Board may make application to the
21 appropriate court for an order enjoining the acts or practices
22 prohibited by this act, and upon a showing by the Electrical Hearing
23 Board that the person has engaged in any of the prohibited acts or

1 practices, an injunction, restraining order, or other order as may
2 be appropriate shall be granted by the court.

3 ~~D.~~ E. If any electrical facilities as defined in the Electrical
4 License Act are in violation of the National Electrical Code set
5 forth in the National Fire Code (Electrical) issued by the National
6 Fire Protection Association, NFPA number 70, current edition, as
7 amended, or any ordinance or other regulation of a city or town, the
8 proper authorities of the state or political subdivision of the
9 state, in addition to other remedies, may institute appropriate
10 action or proceedings to prevent any illegal installation or use of
11 such facilities, to restrain, correct or abate any violation, or to
12 prevent illegal occupancy of a building or structure.

13 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2008.
