7 An Act relating to environment and natural resources;
8 amending 27A O.S. 2001, Section 2-10-202, as amended
9 by Section 1, Chapter 328, O.S.L. 2002 (27A O.S.
10 Supp. 2007, Section 2-10-202), which relates to
11 powers and duties of the Department of Environmental
12 Quality; authorizing municipal and county governments
13 to modify standards for solid waste disposal sites;
14 providing an effective date; and declaring an
15 emergency.

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

17 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 27A O.S. 2001, Section 2-10-202,
18 as amended by Section 1, Chapter 328, O.S.L. 2002 (27A O.S. Supp.
19 2007, Section 2-10-202), is amended to read as follows:

20 Section 2-10-202. A. The Department of Environmental Quality
21 shall have the power and duty to:

22 1. Advise, consult and cooperate with other agencies and
23 instrumentalities of the state, other states and the federal
24 government and with affected groups and industries in the
formulation of plans and the implementation of the solid waste
disposal program;

1 2. Administer and make available such loans and grants from the
2 federal government and from other sources as may be available to the
3 Department for the planning, construction, and operation of solid
4 waste disposal sites;

5 3. Develop a statewide integrated solid waste management plan
6 with input from the public, municipal and county governments and
7 regional solid waste planning and management entities;

8 4. Review and act upon applications for solid waste disposal
9 site permits, inspect construction, operation, closure and
10 maintenance of solid waste disposal sites and establish standards
11 for and oversee the remediation of contaminated soils resulting from
12 releases or spills associated with transit or other activities not
13 subject to permitting requirements and not subject to the
14 jurisdiction of another state environmental agency;

15 5. Perform investigations and inspections which it deems
16 necessary to ensure compliance with the Oklahoma Environmental
17 Quality Code, the Oklahoma Solid Waste Management Act and rules
18 promulgated thereunder and orders, permits and licenses issued
19 pursuant thereto;

20 6. Provide technical assistance to solid waste planning units,
21 public solid waste management service entities, political
22 subdivisions, business and industry, and the general public to
23 promote development and implementation of recycling activities to
24 meet the goals of the Oklahoma Solid Waste Management Act;

1 7. Establish and maintain, or cause to be established and
2 maintained, in cooperation with the Department of Commerce, a
3 database for tracking markets for materials which are being or could
4 be recovered from the municipal solid waste stream in Oklahoma. The
5 database shall contain information including but not limited to the
6 names and addresses of buyers and sellers of secondary materials
7 relevant to Oklahoma, market prices, and specifications required by
8 buyers;

9 8. Establish an office for local solid waste systems
10 development and coordination; and

11 9. Establish a certification program for control officers
12 employed by regional solid waste management districts within this
13 state or governments or county government instrumentalities within
14 this state who are responsible for the investigation and enforcement
15 of the laws of this state relating to illegal dumps. Such certified
16 control officers shall have the authority to investigate and report
17 violations to the proper authority pursuant to the provisions of
18 Section 1761.1 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

19 B. Any ~~local~~ municipal governing body may by ordinance or
20 resolution adopt standards for the location, design, construction,
21 and maintenance of solid waste disposal sites and facilities located
22 within its municipal boundaries which are more restrictive than
23 those promulgated by the Board under the provisions of the Oklahoma
24 Solid Waste Management Act.

1 C. Any county may by resolution adopt standards for the
2 location, design, construction, and maintenance of solid waste
3 disposal sites, excluding transfer stations as defined by Section 2-
4 10-103 of this title, which are more restrictive than those
5 promulgated by the Board under the provisions of the Oklahoma Solid
6 Waste Management Act, subject to the following restrictions:

7 1. The resolution must be in effect on or before the effective
8 date of this act, in order to apply to solid waste disposal sites
9 for which an operational permit has been issued by the Department on
10 or before that date;

11 2. Any such more restrictive resolution adopted during the
12 period from July 1, 2008, through June 30, 2009, shall apply to any
13 solid waste disposal site which applies to the Department for an
14 operational permit on or after July 1, 2008, or which has an
15 application for an operational permit pending with the Department on
16 that date; and

17 3. No such more restrictive resolution shall be adopted by a
18 county after June 30, 2009.

19 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2008.

20 SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
21 of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is hereby
22 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
23 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
