5 agricultural community have established the 25x'25 national campaign
6 with the stated goal of obtaining "25 percent of our energy from
7 renewable resources like wind, solar, and biofuels by the year
8 2025"; and

9 WHEREAS, the 25x'25 action plan, "Charting America's Energy
10 Future", has been widely acclaimed as a visionary course of action
11 for the nation; and

12 WHEREAS, Oklahoma leaders recognize the importance of developing
13 a comprehensive alternative energy industry; and

14 WHEREAS, Oklahoma seeks to lead the nation in research and
15 private sector investment in alternative energy technology
16 development and toward that goal the Oklahoma State Legislature
17 created the Oklahoma Bioenergy Center in 2007, a strategic
18 partnership designed to coordinate resources and research programs
19 to address and undertake complex research facing the biofuels and
20 bioenergy industry in this state.
