17 A Concurrent Resolution commending the athletic
18 prowess of R.W. McQuarters; commending his
19 generosity; and directing distribution.

20 WHEREAS, Robert Williams (R.W.) McQuarters, II, was born
21 December 21, 1976, in Tulsa, Oklahoma. McQuarters played both
22 football and basketball at Booker T. Washington High School in
23 Tulsa, Oklahoma, and at Oklahoma State University (OSU) in
24 Stillwater, Oklahoma. During this time he established himself as a

1 versatile football player who functioned as a defensive back, a wide
2 receiver, and a kickoff return specialist; and

3 WHEREAS, R.W. McQuarters played in the National Football League
4 (NFL) first with the San Francisco 49ers (1998-1999), then with the
5 Chicago Bears (2000-2004), the Detroit Lions (2005), and finally the
6 New York Giants (2006 to the present). During the last season R.W.
7 McQuarters made key interceptions in divisional playoff games
8 against Dallas, Tampa Bay, and Green Bay, and played on the New York
9 Giants Super Bowl XLII championship team; and

10 WHEREAS, R.W. McQuarters' commercial interests include
11 revitalizing his community by the construction of a strip mall in
12 northern Tulsa. He created the Now Is The Time (NITT) Foundation to
13 help the homeless, those with Multiple Sclerosis, and to help
14 prepare high school students for college entrance exams. In 2007 he
15 cut his dreadlocks and donated them to Locks of Love. McQuarters is
16 one of Oklahoma State University's most generous contributors,
17 donating two and a half million dollars to benefit their football
18 program.

19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 2ND SESSION
20 OF THE 51ST OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
21 CONCURRING THEREIN:

22 THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature commends the athletic
23 prowess of R.W. McQuarters and congratulates him for his playoff and
24 Super Bowl XLII victories.
