A Concurrent Resolution commending the Oklahoma Law Enforcement Museum and Hall of Fame for its efforts in recognition and appreciation of Oklahoma law enforcement personnel; designating Tuesday, March 18, 2008, "Law Enforcement Appreciation Day"; and directing distribution.

WHEREAS, Chandler, Oklahoma, is the future home of the Oklahoma Law Enforcement Museum and Hall of Fame. Chandler was selected because of the support of the Lincoln County Historical Society, because it was the home of Marshal Bill Tilghman, and its location is between the state's two largest metropolitan areas – Oklahoma City and Tulsa; and

WHEREAS, the Oklahoma Law Enforcement Museum and Hall of Fame will be divided into law enforcement time periods: the Native American tribal period, the Oklahoma Territorial period, and the Statehood period; and

WHEREAS, each year the Oklahoma Law Enforcement Museum and Hall of Fame will induct a class of men and women, both living and deceased, who have made a significant contribution to the profession of law enforcement. Those inducted will be recognized with the Tilghman Award, named after Marshal Bill Tilghman who served as the U.S. Federal Deputy Marshal, the Sheriff of Lincoln County, the Chief of Police of Oklahoma City, and an Oklahoma State Senator. Marshal Tilghman is buried in Chandler, Oklahoma, and his portrait is displayed in the lounge of the Oklahoma State Senate.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 51ST OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature commends the Oklahoma Law Enforcement Museum and Hall of Fame for its efforts in recognition and appreciation of Oklahoma law enforcement personnel.

THAT the Oklahoma State Legislature designates Tuesday, March 18, 2008, "Law Enforcement Appreciation Day" in the State of Oklahoma.

THAT a copy of this resolution be distributed to the President of the Oklahoma Law Enforcement Museum and Hall of Fame, Carl F. Reheman.
