Bureau of Investigation named the City of Broken Arrow, Oklahoma the
twenty-second safest city in the United States; and

WHEREAS, The Federal Bureau of Investigation examines
demographics, law enforcement services, crime rates, and other data
for communities of similar size in compiling the Uniform Crime
Report; and

WHEREAS, The Broken Arrow Police Department ranked near the top
in crime clearance rates and in investigations of a number of crime
types, including violent crimes, fraud, domestic violence, and
recovery of stolen property; and

WHEREAS, The Broken Arrow Police Department achieved a superior
rating in total training hours while maintaining the second lowest
overall cost per citizen for police services; and

WHEREAS, Broken Arrow was named the safest city in Oklahoma for
the third consecutive year; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of the City of Broken Arrow and the State
of Oklahoma value, appreciate and honor the public service offered
each day by the Broken Arrow Police Department in its dedication to
all.
